## Swavesey & District History Society

January meeting. On a bitterly cold, very frosty night, 35 members heard Mark Pardoe from Hitchin talk on "The Picture Postcard as an Eyewitness to History". The postcard became very popular from 1893 but initially only the address was permitted on the back with a dominant picture and just a very brief message space on the front. From 1903 it became explosively popular when the front was occupied by a much bigger picture with a 50/50 message and address space on the back. In Nottingham there were seven postal collections and deliveries each day. One message simply read "Will meet you at 3.30 this afternoon, not 4". Mark covered topics ranging from the seaside to town centres, transport to entertainment, school photos to farming and from domestic servants to aristocrats. Members readily recognised changes which have taken place since the early 1900s. Thus, the splendid corn exchange in Bury St Edmunds is now a Wetherspoon's pub, the large cattle market in the middle of St Albans is now a busy street and shopping centre and the pleasant, leafy lane leading out of Luton is the main entrance to Luton airport. Ladies invariably wore large, feathered hats while little girls wore pinafores – and often large hats too. Gentlemen apparently paddled in the sea wearing boater hats, their best suits and trousers rolled up to their knees. Scarborough was an elegant seaside resort and photos always showed visitors in expensive clothes. Very few cars were around and it was often clear that the photographer, with his cumbersome equipment, was standing in the middle of the street in major towns. A variety of horse-drawn vehicles was on view, from fast-moving traps to a very large wagon loaded heavily with bales of hops and a splendid 1904 horse-drawn bus in Colchester.

February meeting. The booked speaker failed to arrive so without any recent preparation Carole Pook, the Society's Chairman, delivered an excellent talk on Witchcraft and the Pendle Witches.

Before about 1600 when the country was under Catholic rule witchcraft was not illegal in England. Admittedly, there was a recognised wise woman in most villages who acted as midwife, nurse and apothecary using herbs to cure illnesses and injuries but although these women were often believed to have magical powers, similar to witches, they were accepted in society. With the Reformation, the Protestants took a different view and when James I came to the throne in 1603 the law changed since he was convinced that witchcraft was evil. Christopher Marlowe and Ben Jonson wrote plays about witchcraft and Shakespeare wrote Macbeth in 1606, probably to please James I. From around 1600 to about 1750 a witchcraft craze engulfed Europe with thousands executed. In England around 500 witches were put to death over this period but in Germany the persecution was far more vigorous.

In 1612 in a remote part of the Lancs/Yorks border, Catholic views were still largely adhered to but the ruling class wished to bring in the laws of King James. In this village around Pendle Hill were two rival families with an

awesome reputation for witchcraft: the Chattox and the Demdike families. A good living could be made at the time by posing as witches and the two families, both quite poor, were each trying to make a living from healing by the use of herbs and magical powers but also straying into begging and extortion apparently. One day in March 1612 Alizon, one of the young Demdikes met John Law, a pedlar, and asked him for some pins. Law refused and they parted but as she looked back Alizon saw Law stumble and apparently become instantly lame. Seeing the chance of some prestige in being regarded as a powerful witch Alizon confessed that she caused the injury. Within days the local JP summoned 3 of the Demdikes who quickly accused the Chattox family of even more serious crimes linked to witchcraft. Three days later two Chattox members and one Demdike were summoned by the JP.

The situation very rapidly deteriorated, culminating in one of the most famous witch trials in England which took place at Lancashire Assizes on 18/19 August 1612 when 19 people went on trial. Ten were from the group of twelve known as the Pendle Witches. By now the Pendle Witches were charged with ten murders, mostly of very young children, by the use of witchcraft. Of the ten - eight women and two men – nine were found guilty and executed by hanging; one was found not guilty. In 1736 all laws against witchcraft were repealed

## An update from RSPB Fen Drayton Lakes

Lapwings are wading birds that can be found in grasslands, farmland and wetlands. They are well known for their distinctive calls, giving them the alternative name 'peewit', their complex courtship displays and their striking plumage, in particular their head crests. Sadly, lapwing populations in the UK have declined significantly over the past few decades, predominantly due to changes in agricultural practices and the loss of suitable nesting habitats, meaning that they are now a red-listed species in the UK and are deemed a conservation priority. Here at Fen Drayton Lakes, we have seen a steady decrease in breeding numbers so are working to provide suitable habitats and to implement effective habitat management measures with the aim of helping the species recover.

Lapwings are ground-nesting birds that lay their eggs in shallow scrapes, often in grassy fields. The chicks are born precocial, meaning they leave the nest after hatching and feed themselves with the help of their parents who care for them until they fledge. Nesting lapwings require suitable grass sward and vegetation conditions in order to build their nests and rear their young. The ideal habitat is an area of short, grazed grass with some scattered tussocky vegetation and bare patches with nearby shallow water margins. This type of habitat provides cover for the birds, feeding areas for adults and chicks, and reduces the risk of predation.

The grasslands of Ferry Mere along the northern edge of the lake are the best area for nesting lapwings at the reserve and we carry out management work in order to maintain it as a suitable habitat. The area is grazed by cattle in the summer and autumn to ensure suitable grass conditions the following spring when lapwings are looking to nest with a majority low, even height. This enables the birds to see around them and watch out for predators, thus making them feel more secure and more likely to nest.

Having nearby tall trees and shrubs can deter lapwing from nesting as they provide cover for ground predators, such as foxes, and perching points for avian predators, such as crows, that can take eggs and chicks. In previous years we have worked to fell trees from around the ditches on Ferry Mere and this past winter we have spent time with our volunteer work group removing a dense area of tall trees from the lake edge very near to our shallow pools where lapwings are often seen and have nested in the past. Not only will this improve the area for the birds, but it also has the added benefit of opening up views of the lake from the footpath and view shelter along the north of Ferry Lake.

As we head into spring the large wintering lapwing flocks will start to disperse, but we hope that some will stay and choose to nest out on Ferry Mere or elsewhere at the reserve. We will be carefully monitoring lapwing numbers as part of our annual breeding bird surveying to see the effects of our management work and determine

if there is more we can do. In fact, we are already working on plans for another project to try to ensure the continued presence of shallow pools that remain wet throughout the breeding season. Watch this space for more details in the future.

### Wednesday Wander

Ever thought you'd like to know more about the reserve and its wildlife? Volunteer-led guided walks take place once a month, usually on the second Wednesday.

### Dawn Chorus Walk

Be an early bird and join us on a morning walk around Fen Drayton Lakes to experience the magic of the spring dawn chorus. Listen to the spectacular sounds of the birds bursting into song as the sun rises over the lakes on 29th April.

## Swavesey 100 Years ago (April & May 1923) From the Cambridge Chronicle

### MILK. 13th April 1923

The retail price of milk in Swavesey has been reduced to 5d. per quart.

### A LEAKAGE. 20th April 1923

A correspondent writes: What, may I ask, is the cause of the mysterious leakage which for some days past has been spoiling the fair surface of the public highway near Swan Pond? At first, we thought that another water supply pipe had burst, but now the colour of the liquid leads us to suggest that a drain needs attention.

### THE DRAINS. 20th April 1923

The report of the Ministry of Health Inspector, Dr. H. T. Calvert, who inspected the drainage of Swavesey on Feb. 2<sup>nd</sup>, has been received by the Rural District Council, and on Friday last the Chairman of the Council (Mr. J. Frohock), Mr. F. Kirby (vice-chairman), and the two local councillors (Messrs. R. Norman and C. Wood), made a careful examination of the open drain between Middle Watch and Church End, with a view, it is understood, to remedial measures being adopted, including the erection of a flushing tank in Middle Watch. It is not known whether the district councillors included in their investigations the untrapped gratings to the drain in High-street, near Turn Bridge. The stench from these openings is frequently most offensive, especially at night, and can be remedied.

### NATIONAL SAVINGS. 27th April 1923

Mrs. C. Wood has undertaken the duties of local hon. sec. of the National Savings Scheme and is in attendance at the school every Friday from 6 to 7 p.m., to receive contributions. The scheme is of great service to the individual as well as the State, and is open to all classes of contributors.

### FOOTBALL ENTHUSIASTS. 4th May 1923

Twenty-four passengers travelled from Swavesey Station to London on Saturday by the special Cup Final excursion train, which left at 4.50 a.m. At Swavesey there was standing room only, but from Cambridge, where extra coaches were put on, the journey was made in comfort.

### A NOVEL BRAKE. 18th May 1923

Two old boots formed the brake blocks of a hawker's wagonette which passed through the village on Tuesday morning. The wagonette was laden with goods for sale.

### THE FEAST. 18th May 1923

"Come, gentle Spring, ethereal mildness, come," was the prayer of Swavesey people last weekend, for nice, fine weather is an essential of a successful Feast.

But instead of "ethereal mildness" they had to endure cold, inclement, and stormy weather. Visitors were few compared with the crowds that were wont to attend the annual festival in bygone years, and the showman element was not up to pre-war average. The services at the parish church on Sunday were well attended, especially in the evening, when there was an exceptionally large congregation. The service was bright and hearty, and the choir sang an anthem. During the evening the Willingham Salvation Army Band played in Market Street amongst the assembling Feast folk, and held a meeting. Cricket matches should have been the attraction on Monday and Tuesday afternoons, but owing to the weather they failed to attract the usual crowds. On Monday, Swavesey defeated Lolworth, and on Tuesday managed to score a first innings victory over their Over neighbours. Neither Over nor Swavesey were at full strength – in fact it is understood that there was difficulty in finding players in both villages hardy enough to face the elements. With perhaps two exceptions batsmen and fielders wore coats, and some of the latter even donned long macintoshes. Cricket under such conditions may have been heroic but was hardly cricket. A few shivering spectators crouched under the shelter of the School and of neighbouring houses. There was a better attendance at the "Feast," which, in accordance with custom, was held in Market Street, on Tuesday evening, than on Monday, and it was noticed that the stalls, etc, were arranged on a far better plan than in previous years.

## It Will Probably Be Cloudy...

### A guide to the night sky over Swavesey during April and May.

After the visit of a once every 50,000-year orbit comet C/2022 E3 (ZTF) during January and February, there might be other opportunities to spot comets later in the year. For example, 62P/Tsuchinshan will be approaching the Sun in late 2023, with its closest approach to the Sun on 24<sup>th</sup> December, and its closest point to the Earth on 30<sup>th</sup> January 2024.

The full moon on 6<sup>th</sup> April was known by early Native American tribes as the Pink Moon because it marked the appearance of the moss pink, or wild ground phlox, which is one of the first spring flowers. This moon has also been known as the Sprouting Grass Moon, the Growing Moon, and the Egg Moon. Many coastal tribes called it the Fish Moon because this was the time that the shad swam upstream to spawn. This moon is also known as the Paschal Moon, which is the first Full Moon on or after March 21 and is used to determine the date of Easter.

The Lyrid meteor shower will be visible from 14<sup>th</sup> – 30<sup>th</sup> April, peaking on the 22<sup>nd</sup> – 23<sup>rd</sup> April. It is the oldest recorded meteor shower still visible today and was first recorded in 687 BCE.

The European Space Agency's JUPITER ICy moons Explorer (JUICE) mission is scheduled to launch between 5-25 April 2023. It will take over seven years to reach its destination. JUICE will spend around two years orbiting Jupiter and making close flybys of Europa, Ganymede and Callisto. It will then spend the rest of its planned lifetime orbiting Ganymede, which will make it the first spacecraft to orbit a moon that is not our own. On board JUICE are 10 cutting-edge instruments that will help confirm if some or even all three of Jupiter's moons have oceans of liquid water beneath their crusts. If so, could there be life there?

The Eta Aquariid meteor shower is active from 19 April-28 May, peaking around 6 May and expecting to produce up to 50 meteors per hour. The source of the meteor shower is the famous Comet Halley, which is visible from the Earth every 75-76 years.

The Waxing and Waning Crescent Moon phases in April and May are the best time to see earthshine, where the unlit part of the Moon becomes visible, also known as Da Vinci glow. The best time to see earthshine is a few days before and after the New Moons on 20<sup>th</sup> April and 19<sup>th</sup> May.

The May full moon, on 5<sup>th</sup> May, was known by early Native American tribes as the Flower Moon because this was the time of year when spring flowers appeared in abundance. This moon has also been known as the Hare Moon, the Corn Planting Moon and the Milk Moon.

19<sup>th</sup> May is the third New Moon in a season with four New Moons, making this a Black Moon.

## Recycling on our local fields

Last summer, there was quite a lot of chat/discussion/moaning on Swavesey Village Life (Facebook) about the smell in Swavesey as White's Recycling were working on our local fields. Here at the north end of the village it has been an annual nuisance for some years now, not just the smell, but large tankers frequently parked along the roadside waiting to off-load into the fields. It is particularly bad when they wait at the field opposite St Andrew's church where the road bends slightly and visibility for road users can be very poor. However, it is usually only for a couple of weeks and all part of living in the countryside. Due to the excess smell last summer, (probably caused by the extreme dry weather) and the discussions on Facebook, I sent an email to Whites Recycling to ask if they'd like to let us know what they do each summer to send to our village magazine. So here, for those who are interested is their reply:

*Hi Caroline*

*The material we spread is organic liquid waste from local food and drink production facilities. All our activities are regulated by the Environment Agency via our landspreading permit and the deployment application we submit under that permit.*

*Before we spread any material to land, the Environment Agency require us to have it analysed by an independent laboratory to ensure it is suitable for use as an agricultural fertilizer, and that it does not contain unacceptable levels of potentially toxic elements. The material we spread is a replacement for commercially manufactured and sold fertilizers and is non-hazardous. Once we have completed an application, the waste is deemed to have been fully recovered, rather than being disposed of, which supports a circular economy. A common misconception is that we spread human waste to land. I can confirm that we do not spread human waste to land; all human waste that we handle is taken to water treatment facilities run by Severn Trent Water and Anglian Water.*

*I hope this answers your question?*

## Will Wright Memories

Back in the late 50's and very early 60's most of us youngsters used our bicycles to move around the village and this obviously eventually resulted in going further and travelling to many neighbouring Parishes as well. Those were the days when cycling was the main means of local travel for the bulk of us kids and in fact many adults, as in the 50's there were nearly as many horse & carts on the village roads as there were motor vehicles.

One of the fairly regular spring & summer trips was going to Over and then down to the end of Overcote Rd to access the river for swimming & gaming opposite the Pike & Eel pub. The round trip to Over was also often accessed via Ramper Rd., which in those days was vastly different to today as not only was there a minimal number of daily vehicular movements, but on the straight stretch between Uttons Drove corner & Gravel Bridge Rd, there was 2 dozen or more very large old corrugated iron nisson huts, which were left over from the war-time years when they had been used to store the bombs for the RAF Oakington bomber base. These huts were located on alternate sides of the road verges & still had the original concrete bases and huge sliding doors, so whilst carefully watching the road for traffic we would swing from one side of the road to the other and cycle through many of them, obviously the empty ones that weren't being utilised by the farming fraternity. The road ended with a T junction in those days whereby you would either have to turn left onto Gravel Bridge Rd, to access Over via the Windmill road or right into Longstanton, which was then accessed via the current sports playing field & Pavilion Road, a long time before the village by-pass & its roundabouts, also at the T junction there was a pillbox facing down Ramper Road. It is my understanding this was manned by the local Home guard during the war - must ask Mr Mannering!

The doctors surgery in those days was located in the Manor House on Station road and operated by Doctor Ford, who also used to run a Sunday school bible class for all youths in the village which was very well frequented by many. We had some excellent Xmas parties there and some fantastic summer trips to other parts of the country, one of which I vividly remember was the peak district in Derbyshire where we climbed "Mam Tor".

Clive Oakman & myself had by then got into cycling further distances from the village and were having overnight stays in Youth Hostels en route as we explored different locations. One summer holiday we decided to try a trip to the Peak district having both enjoyed the bible class trip and calculated a 5 day route in the peaks and back, missing most of the major towns & cities though we did have to stop off in Bakewell of course - home of the Tarts! Some of the climbs were naturally a bit of a challenge but the downhill runs made it all worthwhile! Clive's father Ray had made possible a couple of training runs for this as he regularly visited one of the central London markets to purchase the goods for his food retail outlets. We placed our bikes in his van in the early

hours and he dropped us off at the Cambridge roundabout on the North London Circular Rd. We cycled back home on the original old A10 road, this was before the days of by-passes & dual carriageways, let alone motor ways, and so was a good learning trip prior to the the Peaks challenge.

I also cycled to school on Hills Road a few times when the weather was good and I didn't have to catch the school trains enabling me an extra 2 or 3 hours in Cambridge.

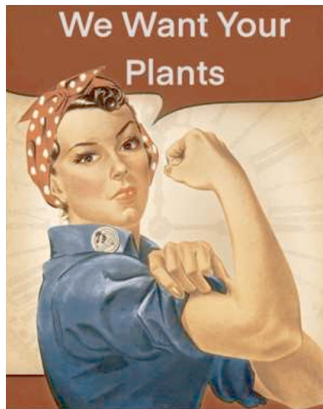

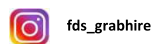

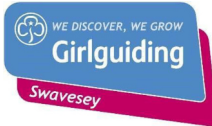

## Rainbows, Brownies, Guides and Rangers. World Thinking Day

On a Saturday afternoon in February around 60 members of Girlguiding Over District met together in Bethel Baptist Church to celebrate World Thinking Day; Rainbows, Brownies, Guides, Rangers, Young Leaders and Leaders. We used the WAGGGS Activity Pack; Our World, Our Peaceful Future and explored what we can learn from the environment and how we can work with nature to create a more peaceful and secure future for girls everywhere.

The girls heard the story of Miku who could wish for anything she wanted – unless it broke the rules of nature. In the middle of winter, she got too cold and wished for it to be warm and sunny, but that was against the rules of nature and her forest vanished into thin air! We then heard the story of the corn maidens who dance to make the flowers grow, but there were no plants and therefore nothing for the mice to eat.

The girls had an activity with balls of wool to learn about how everything in nature works together and is all connected and how a break in any of that affected the whole system. The maidens started to dance again and the plants grew and the mice ate... until there was a rumble! Oh no the volcano had erupted!

The next part of the story was hearing about Pele the Goddess of Volcanos, and the damage natural disasters can do to nature. We played a beetle type game, in mixed groups, with stones (people), leaves (animal habitat) and sticks (technology to keep people and wildlife happy) to try and learn to manage the resources in our world and explore how to build diverse communities with limited resources. We had to be careful as the volcano may erupt and destroy the resources already collected. We found if we worked together and swapped resources, we reached our goals faster.

Then we met Amrita whose King wanted to chop down her forest to build with, we helped her by making a beautiful flower garden which meant the word was full of life again! The girls could choose which flowers they made from the eight craft varieties around the room.

Then we all sat in a circle together and listening to Debbie our District Commissioner asking and telling us about the fact we are part of a fantastic organisation of 10 million girls and women and should be proud of that. We celebrate WTD on February 22nd each year as that is the joint birthday of our founder, Lord Baden Powell and his wife Olave who was the first Chief Guide. Six Guides lit candles to think about people who are all different and each girl turned on a battery light to show they are unique and special. We then rolled coins onto the world map on the floor and thought about girls in different countries. The money was sent to the WAGGGS fund. We then all remade our promises section by section and sang our goodbye songs. It is lovely to all get together for events like this and everyone earned a badge!

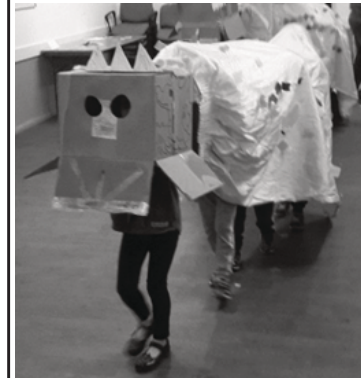

## Parish Council News January/February 2023

### **Councillor Vacancy**

Following the resignation of a Cllr in January we are pleased to have co-opted Sue Ellington to the Parish Council at the February meeting.

### **County Council Highways**

The speed reduction works scheduled for Fen Drayton Rd were delayed earlier this year due to significant cost increases. Following discussions with County Council Highways the proposals were reviewed and we are pleased to confirm that the scheme will go ahead. There has still been a cost increase however the County Council has agreed to maintain its 90% contribution. The scheme should be installed now around the end of March.

We have been advised that repair works to Over Rd to deal with the worst areas closest to Over are scheduled for this coming financial year. In Swavesey the section of Station Rd from Church End to the Busway is scheduled for re-surfacing in some 3-5 year's time.

Hopefully by the time you read this, Buckingham Rd will have had the remaining potholes filled and the entire length surface dressed.

Councillor Mandy Smith arranged a meeting at the School Lane/Thistle Green junction with Safer Routes to School highways officers & Parish Cllrs to continue discussions around this coming year's LHI bid which entails improvements & additional safety measures to this junction.

Northstowe Phase 1 planning conditions include S106 money to provide traffic calming measures for 11 villages around Northstowe. The County Council has started discussions with Parish Councils as to what measures this could provide for the villages. For Swavesey this money can only be used for Ramper Rd-Boxworth End. We have started to look at potential options and will be asking for comments from the community at various events over the coming months. The collection of speed & traffic count data is ongoing, with proof that recent closures of the B1050 as well as traffic using Swavesey as a through-route to Northstowe, has resulted in extreme increases in vehicle movements and this is when there are only some 1300 occupancies in Northstowe.

# COUNCIL NEWS

A house on the bend of Station Road has suffered some damage when hit by a car which mounted the pavement in the early hours.

One of the Market St. bollards has been damaged after being hit by a wheelie bin lorry and will be repaired.

### **District Council business**

An SCDC air quality monitor was located by the primary school entrance for the first 6 months of 2022, the published report shows that recorded levels "represented good air quality".

### **Drainage**

A meeting was held on February 3rd with our MP Anthony Browne and representatives from Anglian Water, Environment Agency (EA), Internal Drainage Board and Parish Council. The aim of the meeting was to highlight the effect future local development will have on the Uttons Drove Sewage Treatment Works (STW) plus the surface water through our drainage scheme. One has to consider the Northstowe build-out, the Bourn airfield site and the continuing growth of Cambourne giving a potential total of approximately 15,000+ dwellings, with associated buildings, with all the foul water flowing through the STW and then treated water through the Swavesey drainage system to the river.

The issue of the river bank height, which is below its design level also continues to be discussed with the EA. The Parish Council also continues to chase the implementation of the telemetry system condition for the Bloor development, with the EA.

### **Planning**

The PC submitted comments on the planning application for two new dwellings on the site of the old barn along Taylors Lane, including that the proposal is outside of the development framework.

### **Council administration**

Cllr Rachel Vollerthun has been appointed PC representative for the Community Orchard Management team. Cllr Colin Parsons has been appointed as a trustee of the Community Pavilion Trust.

Cllr Sue Rogers has been appointed as PC representative of the Carols in Market St committee.

**Other business**

The new 3G artificial pitch at the Village College is now in use. The PC supported this project by way of grant funding and it is a terrific facility for our community. Many congratulations to Tony Rudkin & the team for bringing this project to fruition. Discussions are now underway between the PC, Cambs FA & the Football Foundation to start the next project, which is for new grass-field sports pitches for the community on the Parish land behind Burgess Close.

The Community Orchard should now have a new entrance & access ramp which will provide a much safer & easier access to/from the Orchard alongside Station Rd. The original public right of way entrance will remain in place. Fencing will be installed around the new pond as a requirement of the grant funding provided as part of Natural England's funding scheme for Great Crested Newt habitat, which has to be managed without disturbance. Our thanks to ENVEA UK for grant funding and also the Eastern Farming & Wildlife Advisory Group and congratulations to the Orchard Group management team for making it all possible.

The Sustainability Hub & Biodiversity group together with Shedit have been awarded an SCDC biodiversity grant to enable work on village areas that have been identified for planting & re-wilding.

A new Rowan tree provided by a District Council free trees scheme has been planted in Whitton Close by the resident's re-wilding group.

The PC has supported a resident's request to Virgin Media to relocate the junction boxes along the footpath by the Londis shop. Support was also given to the RSPB for a grant application for projects in the Fen Drayton Lakes Nature Reserve and to CamCycle for their application to the Big Give Green fund to support local community walking and cycling projects.

The PC agreed to provide S106 money to the Sustainability Hub for gift packets of wildflower seeds to visitors to the spring event and linked to the King's Coronation in May.

At last we have warmer weather and a promise of summer around the corner. As I write this I am preparing for the District Council Budget meeting in February. I am happy to report that the council appears to be on a sound financial footing unlike many other councils but I wish they had not decided to increase council tax when so many are finding problems in making ends meet.

Many of you will have noticed that the housing development in Middlewatch has stopped. This is expected to recommence in the summer but I will keep you informed. I am chairman of the liaison committee for developers in Swavesey. This helps to enable developers to work together and cause minimum problems in the village as well as the Parish, District and County officers to help iron out issues. It has worked very well and I would like to thank all those involved.

Compass Cafe continues to welcome all ages to coffee and homemade cake on a Thursday morning 10.30 to 12. Each week of the month is run by village organisations - St. Andrew's Church, Bethel Baptist Chapel, WI, PTA, and Girl Guides. But on the 5th Thursday other village organisations are welcome to take control. This can raise funds for special projects, charities or organisations. If you are interested in taking a 5th Thursday contact me or Caroline Stevens or drop in and have a word. The Community Warden Scheme is running the 5th Thursday in March.

Peterborough and Cambridge Combined Authority are currently consulting on a Bus Strategy. This is supported financially by the Government and seeks to build a service with the following aims :


- An integrated, coherent network linking people to the places they want to get to:
- Bus services for rural areas
- Getting to places quickly and on time
- Value for money and simple, integrated ticketing
- Delighting customers

I would support these ideals but fear it might be very difficult to achieve especially as the current bus service is so poorly used at the moment.

As District Councillor I have always focused on the importance of community and I become more and more aware that local transport (within the village) is probably the most important service to enable residents to meet, reduce loneliness, and promote our community. We desperately need a spontaneous service which will enable residents to get to the guided bus, doctors surgery, Church, Chapel, Village College, Memorial Hall and Thistle Green as well as visit relatives. The community car service do a wonderful job but they are short of drivers and have to focus on hospital and Health appointments usually, outside the village. I am writing this to see if there is anybody who has any ideas about how we can work towards a local transport service. Please contact me - if we work together it ought to be possible to introduce a service on one or two days a week.
