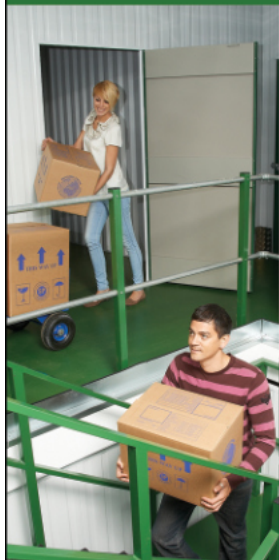

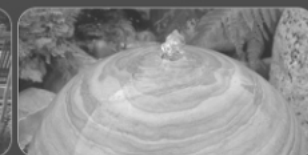

Will Wright Memories (Continued from last issue)

When we started our 3rd school year at the County on Hills Rd. there were changes in the school curriculum whereby we were given the opportunity to join the cadet corps, which entailed training periods of about an hour & a half hour on Wednesday afternoons when the lads would be marching around the playgrounds. I didn't really fancy this so I took the advice of my 2 fellow pupil village friends, Tim Parish & Nicky Alsop, and took the main alternative option which was to join the school gardening club. This group operated on the garden area to the rear of the school buildings between the tarmac play areas & the railway line boundary. A major benefit of this was when bad weather made gardening impractical we were moved to the library where we could all get on with our homework. Our "Head" boy at the time was none other than Roger Waters, who was later to form the Pink Floyd along with Sid Barrett, another County boy for 4 years or so. One of the pupils in Tim & Nicky's year was Storm Thorgerson, who was later to become the art designer for millions of album covers including of course "The Dark Side of the Moon".

It always amused me on the days when fellow pupils would be wearing their military uniforms with so many of them proudly displaying the "ban the bomb" badges which were everywhere in Cambridge. These were in the early 60's in the days of the cold war, but to our generation I'm sure there was more interest in the new music & songs that were being created with availability on plastic singles & albums.

I think it was during my 4th year at the County when I had got involved in regular chats with a couple of friends, both of whom played guitars as a hobby and they suggested we should maybe get together & see if we could form a band as we all had similar preferences in the music of the day - the sixties were I believe unique as the music world was opening up big time! They both lived in Girton and had access to a wooden hut which I believe was used by the local village community groups including the Scouts and so we started rehearsing once or twice a week with a few extra days during the holiday periods.

I had been banging away on my drum kit up in the first floor loft space of our house for a few years and it was opening up a whole new world being able to play with other musicians, as we had by now expanded to a 4 piece band and had actually played to local community groups as an audience and taken the name of "The Aztecs", not quite sure where it came from but there you go. Out of the blue we got the chance to play in a local pub in Willingham, I think it was called the White Hart, needless to say it is no longer a pub! It was the first time we received payment for our services - I reckon it was £10. The major problem was that we not only had no form of transport, in fact none of us were old enough to drive and so had to pay someone who had a van to transport us & the equipment to & from the venue, needless to say we ended up out of pocket but never-the-less had a great evening.

The Aztecs came to an end as we were all getting ready for our forthcoming O level examinations, the results of which would influence the futures of all the lads as the expectation at the school was that the bulk of the pupils would go on to take their chosen A level subjects for 2 years in the 6th form and then to move on to take a place at one of the Cambridge Colleges.

Do football seasons ever end in the 21st century? England beat North Macedonia 7-0 in a competitive international at Old Trafford on 19 June whilst the English cricket team was playing in the first test of the 2023 Ashes at Edgbaston on the same day. The 2023 men's FA Cup Final was on 3 June, kicking off at 3pm, the traditional kick off time returned if nothing else from yesteryear survived. 50 years ago, the FA Cup was won by an Ian Porterfield goal (or was it a Jimmy Montgomery double save?) Sunderland's 1-0 victory over Leeds United on 5 May 1973 kicked off at 3pm, it was the last time that a team from the north east won the FA Cup, the last final to be played using an orange ball and the last time that the winning matchday squad at kick off did not boast a single international cap between them. A Newcastle United victory in 2024 would change one of these facts?

The English Football League kicks off 2023/24 on 5 August 2023 (Cambridge United preserved their League One (3rd division in "old speak")) status on the final day of the 2022/23 season, Premier League football is back on 11 August. Spartans league games are scheduled to start on 9 September.

The finals of the Women's World Cup 2023 in Australia and New Zealand conclude on 20 August with the final from Sydney (1100 ko UK time). Will the USA complete a hat trick of triumphs, will England win for the first time, or will one of the other 30 finalists come out victorious?

Swavesey Spartans celebrated the 2022/23 season on 18 June at Swavesey Village College (SVC) on their new Artificial Grass Pitch (AGP). We reflected on the 2022/23 season whilst watching intra-club football tournaments the day culminated with the traditional award presentations. Jez Daniel won the Lewis Mannion Shield for over a decade of support to the club, support he continues to provide as his 3rd child is now a Spartan. The presentations were made by 2 players whose football pathway involved playing in Swavesey. Liam O'Neil pulled on a Swavesey Spartans shirt before progressing into the West Bromwich Albion (WBA) academy via the Histon FC youth programme. Liam played in the Premier League for WBA, gained experience in Finland and with Scunthorpe United before moving to Chesterfield and in 2017 onto Cambridge United. Liam has played over 160 first team games for "The U's". Issy Bryant was a Bar Hill based SVC student who has played for Cambridge City, Ipswich Town and for England at youth level. Issy is currently studying in the USA on a soccer scholarship

A special mention for the Under 14 boys who sustained 2 competitive teams last season with the "Royals" winning the League Cup and retaining first place in the highest division within their age group with a remarkable 100% record in 2022/23. Well done to the players and coaches involved.

May meeting. More than 40 heard Paul Fellows from Over tell the fascinating story of “The Search for Planet Vulcan”. Paul is a Fellow of The Royal Astronomical Society and Resident Astronomer on board the QEII.

In 1684 at a dinner for gentlemen, Edmund Halley, Robert Hook and Christopher Wren discussed comets, gravity and the inverse square law. They knew that Isaac Newton was also on the case so Halley funded him to tidy the mass of random papers on his desk, mostly of complex mathematical calculations, and in 1687 Newton’s master work “Philosophiae Naturalis Principia Mathematica” was published. Using Newton’s three laws of motion, this formed the basis of classical mechanics; the theory of how large bodies move under gravity.

By 1859 the French mathematician Le Verrier had already spent much of his life creating an accurate mathematical model of the Solar System but Mercury, the planet closest to the sun, was proving problematic because it was moving around the sun slightly faster than the influence of the other planets – Venus, Earth and so on – could explain. Mercury simply wasn’t obeying the rules of gravity as defined by Newton. For Le Verrier the solution was obvious: some undetected mass, orbiting even closer to the Sun, was giving Mercury a regular gravitational push. Given its closeness to the unimaginable heat of the Sun, the new world was quickly named Vulcan, after the classical god of fire, volcanoes and the forge.

In 1781 William Herschel had discovered Uranus. Le Vernier found Uranus was also slightly wobbly and by detailed back-calculation he predicted a new planet was pulling it slightly off course. He sent his calculations, based on Newtonian mechanics, to German astronomer Johann Galle who successfully found Neptune in the right place in 1864, a very powerful demonstration of the ability of modern science to anticipate and predict. Similarly, it seemed logical that planet Vulcan was affecting Mercury and astronomers started looking for Vulcan with real excitement and claimed sightings were soon coming in, often from reputable sources. But nobody could prove beyond doubt that they had found Vulcan.

Then in 1915 Albert Einstein proved the theory of general relativity which showed that gravity is actually the curvature of spacetime caused by matter. This was an entirely different understanding of gravity from that of Newton and it showed that the peculiarities in Mercury’s orbit were the results of the curvature of spacetime caused by the mass of the Sun. With general relativity, there was no need for Vulcan. It kept the audience spellbound though.

June meeting. For our final meeting of the season, Joanna Hudson from Pampisford related the emotional story of the short life of “George Brewster, the Last Climbing Boy”. George was apprenticed in Cambridge to William Wyer, master chimney sweep. In February 1875 Wyer forced George to climb one of the three main boiler chimneys of the County and City of Cambridge and Isle of Ely Lunatic Asylum at Fulbourn. He struggled to move in the unusually narrow shaft and became stuck within 15 minutes. A wall was knocked down by which time George had suffocated to death. He was eleven years old. On 13 Feb The Cambridge Independent Newspaper reported the inquest into his death where the jury returned

a verdict of manslaughter against Wyer who was sentenced to six months in prison with hard labour.

George’s death was a major catalyst for change. When reports in London newspapers of his inquest were read by the 7th Earl of Shaftesbury, he vowed to act and led the successful campaign to push a Bill through Parliament. In September 1875 a law was passed ending the use of children as ‘climbing boys’ in England. George was the last climbing boy to die in the country, and his death helped provoke the change that led to the end of all child labour practices in industries such as farming, mining and in factories. In 1876, compulsory education for children was recommended and four years later a further Education Act made school attendance compulsory.

Joanna tenaciously searched records and eventually discovered George was buried in an unmarked grave in an abandoned, seriously overgrown corner of Mill Road cemetery and she has set up a fundraising page to pay for a blue plaque in his memory and to place a commemorative statue on his grave. Capital Park, who took over ownership of the site at the beginning of 2023 have willingly agreed to allow the plaque to be placed near the site of the chimney and the current Earl of Shaftesbury has agreed to unveil it in due course. Meanwhile Joanna is busy searching for living descendants of George – can any reader help here? George is the only child in the country to have his own blue plaque.

It Will Probably Be Cloudy...

A guide to the night sky over Swavesey during August and September.

Mid-August will see the reappearance of the Perseid meteor shower, caused by the debris stream from the comet Swift-Tuttle. The shower will radiate between the constellations Perseus and Camelopardalis, and you may see activity from mid-July. The peak of the Perseids is Saturday 12th and Sunday 13th August this year. Fortunately, the maximum is about three days before the New Moon, so conditions will be favourable.

There will be two Super Full Moons in August, one on 1st August and another on 31st August. The Moon will be near its closest approach to the Earth and may look slightly larger and brighter than usual. The full moon on 1st August was known by early Native American tribes as the Sturgeon Moon because the large sturgeon fish of the Great Lakes and other major lakes were more easily caught at this time of year. This moon has also been known as the Green Corn Moon and the Grain Moon.

The full moon on 31st August is referred to as a blue moon, since this is the second full moon in the same month.

Mercury is visible to the naked eye, but it is a bit of a challenge. It's so close to the Sun that the separation between the two isn't particularly large as seen from Earth. During the moment of greatest Eastern Elongation on 10th August, we will have our best chance to spot it, low towards the west as the Sun is setting.

Two weeks after the Super Sturgeon Moon, the New Moon on 16th August is a Micromoon. This is the point in the Moon's orbit farthest away from Earth.

Saturn moves into opposition on 27th August. It will be brighter than any other time of the year and will be visible all night long. A medium-sized or larger telescope will allow you to see Saturn's rings and a few of its brightest moons.

Neptune moves in to opposition on 19th September. Due to its extreme distance from Earth, it will only appear as a tiny blue dot in all but the most powerful telescopes.

The September full moon is on 29th September. This full moon was known by early Native American tribes as the Corn Moon because the corn is harvested around this time of year. This moon is also known as the Harvest Moon. The Harvest Moon is the full moon that occurs closest to the September equinox each year. This is also the last of four supermoons for 2023.

The Autumnal equinox occurs on 23rd September marking the end of summer and the start of Autumn in the Northern Hemisphere.

Swavesey 100 years ago (August & September 1923) From the Cambridge Chronicle

BANK HOLIDAY. 10th Aug. 1923 A large number of visitors were in the village over the weekend, some of whom are extending their stay beyond the Bank Holiday. On Monday 180 market tickets were issued from Swavesey Station to St. Ives, and 43 cheap tickets to Cambridge for the Mammoth Show.

CRICKET. 10th Aug. 1923 With reference to the recent correspondence on big hitting in cricket, the captain of the Swavesey Cricket Club informs me that some years ago E. J. Warboys, playing for Swavesey against Abbey United, on Parker's Piece, hit a ten. Either two or three of the runs resulted from an overthrow, but as the Swavesey score book has been destroyed, exact details cannot be ascertained.

KILLED BY WASPS. 17th Aug. 1923 A goat belonging to Mr. Charles Savage, while feeding on Tuesday evening in a Drove near Turn Bridge, was attacked by a swarm of wasps, and was stung so badly that it died during the night. It is believed that the animal had disturbed a wasps' nest.

A MOTORCYCLE MISHAP. 31st Aug. 1923 A motor cyclist with a lady on a pillion behind him, had a narrow escape from a serious accident when riding along the Huntingdon Road on Thursday, the 23rd inst. Near the turning to Boxworth, the handlebar snapped off, and the cyclist was unable to steer, and completely lost control of the machine. Luckily the road was clear of other vehicles, and, after wobbling about for some yards, the cycle toppled over, depositing the cyclist and his passenger on the ground. Fortunately, beyond a few abrasions, neither was hurt, and a motor car coming on the scene, they were taken on to Cambridge.

THE RECREATION GROUND. 7th Sept. 1923 A ratepayer writes: I should like to call attention to two matters connected with the Recreation Ground or Play Green. In the first place, I would point out that when the footbridge and stile leading from the Recreation Ground towards Brick-hill drove were re-erected some little time ago by direction of the Parish Council, no steps were provided for the stile, thus rendering its use practically impossible by women, and also by men who are not as active as they once were? Secondly, who is responsible for looking after the movable fence which was put up a few years since by the Parish Council for the protection of the cricket pitch? Several of the rails are lying in different parts of the green, some are broken, and one or two have been used as football goalposts. The fence, as it stands, is useless for the purpose for which it was provided, and, if the pitch does not at present need protection, it should, I think, be removed and stored in a place where it can be taken care of. It is true that

the cost of the fence, about £26, I believe, did not fall on the rates, as it was paid for out of money received from the letting of the herbage on the Recreation Ground. But that is no reason why money should be wasted owing to the neglect of those persons who are responsible for the care of the ground, and in my opinion the cost of putting the fence in proper condition should not be paid out of the herbage money, but should be defrayed by the persons who did the damage, or failing them, by those whose duty it is to look after the ground.

RAILWAY ITEM. 14th Sept. 1923 When the 5.41 down passenger train arrived at Swavesey station on Sunday, it was noticed that the engine and all the coaches bore the initial letters, L.N.E.R. This was the first complete L.N.E.R. train to pass through Swavesey.

EXCURSION. 21st Sept. 1923 Thirty-three passengers were booked from Swavesey station on Wednesday morning by the excursion train to Great Yarmouth.

VILLAGE LIBRARY. 21st Sept. 1923 A fresh consignment of books having been received from the County Education Committee, the village library will be re-opened at the National School this (Friday) evening, from 7 to 8 p.m. In future the library will be open on Wednesday evenings for adults, and on Fridays for children.

Perhaps the most beautiful of our doves and pigeons, the Turtle Dove is a cherished sight in our landscape and one which has been celebrated in poetry and art since the time of Chaucer. With orange scalloped wings, rose-hued breast and black-and-white striped neck patch this is a distinctive bird. They have nothing to do with turtles themselves; the name comes from their repeated purring call which sounds like the French word – ‘Tourterelle’.

This species migrates to Sahelian Africa in the autumn and doesn't return until the following May, spending longer away from the UK than here. The migration is a perilous one and is made even harder by the risk of hunting around the Mediterranean along their journey. This, in combination with a few other causes such as agricultural intensification and habitat loss, has led to the Turtle Dove becoming the UK's fastest-declining bird species with numbers down 98% since the 1970s. A national survey carried out in 2021 found that there were only around 2,100 territories left across the country.

Given this context we are pleased that Fen Drayton Lakes continues to provide a home for several Turtle Doves which have returned and are

singing this year. The best places to see them are around Holywell or Far Fen where a scan of the treetops and listening out for the gentle call could help you find them. There have been up to six males in recent years, but it is very hard to tell if they have bred as they become tricky to see during the summer months. However, late last summer we were overjoyed to see young birds following their parents around, learning to feed for themselves.

As part of our reserve management to help the doves, we ensure there are thick hedges for the birds to nest in which are left undisturbed during the breeding season. They also need somewhere to feed such as wildflower-rich field margins that provide a profusion of seed. We supplement this with additional seed to give them a helping hand. The

final requirement is somewhere to drink and the margins of the lakes provide lots of opportunities to quench their thirst. As well as efforts on reserves, the RSPB also runs a partnership project called Operation Turtle Dove, with the aim to reverse the decline by assisting farmers and landowners with advice and support. The project is raising awareness of the plight of this lovely species so that generations of people in the future will be inspired by the special wildlife that chooses the UK as home.

Wednesday Wander

Ever thought you'd like to know more about the reserve and its wildlife? Volunteer-led guided walks take place once a month, usually on the second Wednesday.

The Thomas Galon Charity

Are you aware of this village charity which has been supporting the community, primarily elderly residents, for many hundreds of years?

In 1528 Thomas Galon left agricultural land in his Will for the benefit of the community of Swavesey. A charity was set up enabling the land to be rented out and the income used to help those in need.

Since then the charity has provided winter fuel grants to elderly residents, grants to local doctors' surgeries, Day Centres and Hospices whose services benefit residents of Swavesey and individual grants to residents for various support services (within the charity scheme).

Energy Grant

An Energy Grant Scheme is available for elderly residents. Under this scheme, residents who are aged 70 or over and have lived in the village for 2 years or more can apply to the Thomas Galon Charity for an energy grant, to help with rising energy costs. At the November meeting, Trustees will then consider the amount of grant, depending on funds available, to be paid in the December.

An application form is available if you wish to apply for assistance from this scheme. Please contact the Clerk to the Trustees, Linda Miller at thomasgaloncharity@swavesey.org.uk or call 01954 202982.

The charity trustees meet twice a year in April and November. Grants can be provided to residents for assistance with medial and wellbeing services or items. From Your DC - Sue Ellington

Hello Everybody

I hope you are all having a good summer and getting involved in all the community activities and groups there are in the village. It is always good to welcome new members and help our newer residents to feel part of our community.

I thought I would let you know that the council will be taking over the enforcement of parking from the police in the Autumn. This has to be agreed by Parliament first but is expected to come into force in October. The new civic traffic wardens will only be able to issue fines for parking on double yellow lines and areas which are clearly signposted. Inconsiderate parking and obstructing exits etc are not part of their remit but they may offer advice where necessary. Hopefully this will improve safety and obviously the introduction of this system will be closely monitored. When this was proposed at council it was indicated that funding for the service was only for 3 years. I was told there wouldn't be a need after that - I fear that will not be true!

The 4 day week experiment continues to be controversial but the initial 6 month experiment has been extended by a further 12 months. I do find it difficult to contact the officers I need to speak to because they are only working 4 days but also because 2 of those days may be at home. I was however concerned that there is a plan to offer a 4 day week to the refuse operatives. Now they have to empty the same number of bins and they often run to complete their rounds now. How can they speed up? The answer is that the joint refuse service with the city council will buy two more eco lorries and employ two more crews to achieve this aim. To me this is an expensive fugg of the 4 day week principle which will cost the council a lot of money.

I am sorry I have not been around since April due to a useful bit of surgery but I have been attending meetings virtually and sorting Swavesey issues as usual. All the necessary annual policies and procedures were reviewed, along with review and adoption of statutory documents and appointments. All of which are available on the Parish Council's Website.

County Council Business

The Buckingham Road surface dressing has finally been completed between the A1307 roundabout and Boxworth End farm and similarly the Over road surface water gullies have been sluiced - now we just need some rain to clarify the effectiveness!

The deferred dates for road surface works were a result of having to wait until necessary works on the Longstanton by-pass and had been completed and which were unfortunately delayed. There have been many comments regarding the amount of traffic in Boxworth End, much of this was a result of the closure of the B1050 between Bar Hill & Willingham.

The issue of illegal parking has been brought up by several parishioners, in particular of parking on double yellow lines and blocking footpath access which is a problem throughout the village, but with very little regular official enforcement we are to a large degree restricted. The PC is in contact with the local police in an effort to get them to carry out more regular visits to enforce parking, especially given the number of vehicles in the village. In the meantime we please ask drivers to park legally & considerately.

It was agreed to apply for a dropped kerb in the Station Rd footpath at the side of the new orchard gate, to enable full access after the new entrance has been installed, which should be during July.

The PC is writing to CCC to ask about additional funding from the Adults & Health Committee towards the Cambridgeshire Community Warden Schemes.

The next stage in discussions and consultation on traffic calming options for the southern end of the village is scheduled for September/October.

District Council Business

The surface water pump on the Burgess Close site is now installed & operational. The PC is chasing up the completion work for the highway and footpath surfacing and the junction with Boxworth End. Gtr Cambridgeshire Planning is also following this up.

COUNCIL NEWS

Planning

Permission has been granted for the conversion of 63 Middle Watch into a retirement living development comprising 6 flats with associated parking & landscaping.

The PC has submitted comments on other applications.

Other Business

The PC is reviewing all existing street furniture with a view to replacing, relocating and installing additional litter bins in various areas around the village.

The new PC website now includes more detailed information on many community services and facilities as well as statutory PC information. A dedicated page will also be available on the traffic calming and speeding discussions with CCC.

Following a discussion with the County Armed Forces Covenant Officer, it was agreed to sign up to the Covenant to support the Armed Forces community. A PC action plan is being drawn up to provide support information.

The PC has agreed to plans for the improvement of the open space area on the Carters Way/Priory Avenue estate. Raised planting beds and children's painted floor games will be provided to create a community garden area.

By the time you read this the Swavesey Scout group will have carried out a litter pick in various areas of the village in July, which we thank them for. Similarly the SVC Student Experience Week will have carried out their project to clean up the children's play equipment plus benches around the Recreation Green and Market St Green. Thank you.

Parish Cllrs were pleased to attend the formal opening of the Community artificial pitch facility at the Village College on Sunday 18th June, alongside the annual Spartans Day Tournament.

CPR & Defibrillator Training – with the support of the Thomas Galon Charity, two training sessions were held during July at the Memorial Hall, with training from Magpas Air Ambulance on how to carry out CPR and use a defibrillator. These proved to be very popular and we thank Magpas for being able to provide the training.

E-SCOOTERS

We have received numerous complaints of E-Scooters being ridden on village roads & footpaths. Please note that the use of privately owned E-scooters is ONLY legal on privately owned land and it is ILLEGAL for them to be ridden on all other land which includes village roads & footpaths. Please could those using these stop this before there is a serious accident!



E-scooters: Christmas gift guidance

The more organised among us might have started doing, or planning, our Christmas shopping. With that in mind, one of the big gift requests this festive season is likely to be an electric scooter, or e-scooter.

Following a presentation from Cambridgeshire Police and the South Cambs Community Safety Partnership to parish councils in September, we wanted to provide you with some helpful information about e-scooter use.

It's currently against the law to ride an e-scooter on a public road or pavement. The only exception to this is in zones where trials are taking place, such as some areas within the city of Cambridge. In these areas, hired scooters can be used on the road and on cycle paths.

E-scooters can never be used on the pavement, and e-scooters you may purchase can never be used:

- On a public road without complying with several legal requirements, which users will find very difficult
- In spaces that are set aside for use by pedestrians, cyclists, and horse-riders; this includes on the pavement and in cycle lanes

You can buy e-scooters from many popular retailers, and your children may report to you that all their friends already have one. However, the law is clear - the only place an e-scooter can be used is on private land. So, right now, you can buy one, but you can't ride it on a UK public road, cycle lane or pavement.

If you are stopped by police while using an e-scooter illegally, they will advise you of the current law about how to use one legally and ask you to take your e-scooter home. They may however still penalise you depending on the nature and gravity of the offence.

This is all because e-scooters are classed as a motor vehicle in the same way that motorbikes and cars are. This means they are subject to the same


legal requirements, such as MOT, licensing, tax, and insurance. As e-scooters do not have numberplates, indicators, and do not always have visible rear lights, they cannot be used legally on the roads. Further details

Cambridgeshire Police say: "We understand the public's support for environmentally friendly modes of transport. We want to work with the public to make sure the roads are safe for everyone. The UK Government is currently taking part in "Future Transport Zone" trials for e-scooter hire, with a view to making them legal to use on the roads. 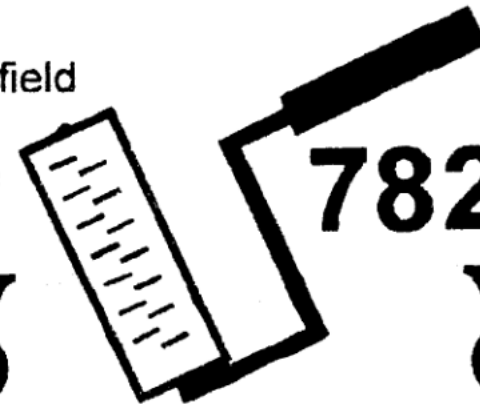

Why am I being given this flyer?

Because it's currently against the law to ride an e-scooter on a public road or pavement.



We understand that buying an e-scooter can be tempting, especially as you can get them from many popular retailers.

However, the current law is clear

You can buy one but you can't ride it on a UK public road, cycle lane or pavement. The only place an e-scooter can be used is on private land.

Why is this?

E-scooters are classified as Personal Light Electric Vehicles (PLEVs), so they are treated as motor vehicles and subject to the same legal requirements.

At a recent Police presentation to South Cambs Parish Councils questions were asked about the increasing use of e-scooters around village roads and pavements.

The Community Safety Partnership has produced this leaflet to explain the current law about the use of e-scooters.

What happens if I've been stopped by Police?

The Police will advise you of the current law about how to use an e-scooter legally and ask you to take your e-scooter home. They may however still penalise you depending on the nature and gravity of the offence.

We understand the public's support for environmentally friendly modes of transport. We want to work with the public to make sure the roads are safe for everyone.

The UK Government is currently taking part in 'Future Transport Zone' trials for e-scooter hire, with a view to making them legal to use on the roads.
