## Swavesey Spartans FC



### The Club

The new season has started with a bang with all teams enjoying the relatively warm weather deep into October and enjoying playing on the new Artificial Grass Pitch at Swavesey Village College. Some of our teams are still looking/have space for new players to add to the 204 already registered. If you are interested, please contact Neil Jordison, Club Secretary, at [Swavesey.secretary@gmail.com](mailto:Swavesey.secretary@gmail.com) who can advise on capacity which is currently limited.

### How we operate

We have boys and girl's teams entered in local leagues and we have players who only want to train. Fees start at £95 (training only) for the season and rise to £140 for players involved in competitive matches. The fee's cover training costs, club insurance and mandatory activities that the club needs to comply with including ensuring that we remain FA Chartered Compliant. For the first time in the Club's history, all teams will be able to train all season on the new artificial grass pitches at Swavesey Village College (previously it was only winter that the club trained on this surface). We will also continue to host our annual celebration Spartans Day. At this end of season event, each player receives a memento, and the league teams have annual awards presented. Each team plays around 20 league games and most enter the annual cup competition for their age group. During the summer players and parents take a break, some put on their whites and play cricket, and some enter various small, sided tournaments representing Spartans that are held across our region.

This season sees the Spartans form an Under 7's (school Year 2) squad (boys and girls) with a view to taking their first steps into in the mini league in the 2024/2025 season. The Under 7's team train on Tuesday evenings from 1800 till 1900. Current FA regulations mean that we cannot allow anybody to join the club until they have had their 6<sup>th</sup> birthday.

At the other end of the Spartans lifecycle our Under 17- and 18-year-olds are now graduating to open age football clubs based in the village. Spartans provide that opportunity with the affiliated ladies team playing on Sundays in the Cambridgeshire League. Currently 4 of our girls Under 17s turn out for the ladies' team on a regular basis. We also have 4 of our boys who feature on Saturday afternoon for Swavesey Institute FC.

### Swavesey Institute FC

Swavesey Institute has been established a lot longer than Spartans, and field 2 men's teams. Institute were the most successful local club throughout the 1960s. They were always in the higher reaches of the Cambridgeshire leagues but fell away in the 1990s. They suffered a revival to reach the Cambridgeshire senior leagues again just after the Millenium. Another dip and recovery have occurred recently to see them back in Senior B, with the Reserves 4 tiers below them for 2023/24.

## Swavesey & District History Society

September meeting. About 40 attended the first talk of the 2023/24 season when Peter Daldorph from Girton took us back to the 1650s to speak of "The Scottish Soldiers and the Ouse Washes". Heritage Lottery-funded research allowed him to thoroughly review the minutes of the 805 meetings of the Company of Adventurers held from 1649 to 1656. Meetings were in London, usually at Temple Bar, and the full documents are now stored at the Cambridgeshire Archive in Ely.

After Charles I's execution, Scotland recognised Charles II as king of all of Britain in 1650 and began recruiting an army to support him. The English were not having this and sent the New Model Army into Scotland. Despite having fewer men, Cromwell's tactics won the battle of Dunbar in September 1650 and at least 6,000 Scots were taken prisoner from an army of 12,500 or fewer. In the following year the Scottish army, under Charles II, marched south in an unsuccessful attempt to rally Royalist supporters in England. They got as far as Worcester but in September 1651 they were defeated again by Cromwell and a further 10,000 prisoners taken.

The Scottish prisoners were marched down to London, with many dying on the way, and put into prison in terrible conditions. The first Bedford river from Earith to Denver, completed in the early 1630s, had failed so after the Civil War ended work started on the second Bedford river. Some of the prisoners were sent to the coal mines, some to work on plantations in the Caribbean and others sent to drain the fens. 166 arrived at Earith on 15 Oct 1651. In all about 500 Scottish prisoners were part of a total workforce of over 10,000 men. Since they were prisoners the Company of Adventurers paid them nothing and working conditions were appalling. Many tried to escape but this was difficult because the few roads were well guarded, locals were required to report it if they saw a prisoner and risking moving through the vegetation and swamps was very dangerous. Within a year after they arrived most of the drainage work was completed so the prisoners were simply set free. Whereas many made their way back to Scotland, it is also possible that many stayed within the area.

October meeting. Filth and disease is how Mike Muncaster of Kimbolton began his talk to 40 members on "The Nineteenth Century Explosion of Cholera". Between 1831 and 1866, four Asiatic cholera outbreaks struck England, as part of pandemics that affected the whole world. Cholera causes people to be convulsed with pain, intense vomiting and uncontrollable watery diarrhoea. The first incidence in England occurred in Sunderland in October 1831 when a ship carrying infected sailors docked at the port. Usually about 50% of those infected die in agony within a matter of hours and 52,000 died by the end of 1832. Doctors who had worked for the army in India soon recognised it as Asiatic cholera but there was no known cure. A second outbreak followed in 1848-9 and caused the death of precisely 53,293 people although this is suspected of being a significant underestimate.

The population of England doubled between 1801 and 1851 but the population of large cities such as Liverpool, Manchester and Birmingham increased four times yet there was no corresponding improvement in water supply or sewage management. The Thames and other city rivers supplied both drinking water and effluent disposal and there was no refuse collection. Sanitary conditions in crowded, poor areas of cities were squalid. Human waste piled up in courtyards and overflowed from basement cesspits into the gutters and waterways. The 1848 Public Health Act established a Central Board of Health but this had limited powers.

The third outbreak occurred in 1854 and in Norwich the river Wensum, which supplied drinking water to the city, was found to be heavily polluted with sewage by a sanitary inspector from the local Board of Health. At the same time, Wisbech was recorded as one of the least healthy places in England with 140 cases of cholera, of which 80 died.

A number of causes of cholera were suggested initially such as poisonous air, drunkenness and indecent behaviour. Then in 1854, London physician John Snow created a map depicting where cases of cholera occurred in Soho, a poor district of central London with unhygienic housing and living conditions and found them to be clustered around a water pump on Broad Street. He identified a baby at the upper end of the street as the first case and pinpointed how the family's cesspool had leaked into Broad Street well. This discovery confirmed Snow's research, helping to prove that cholera is waterborne, not airborne.

A comfortably-off lady in Hampstead had her drinking water regularly imported in barrels from the river Thames because she preferred the taste. She died of cholera.

## Parish Council & Sustainability Hub Biodiversity Projects

During 2023 we have worked together on projects to increase biodiversity and bring forward sustainability events and ideas. Some very visible with lots of comments and thanks such as the colourful wildflowers alongside Swan Pond this summer (last Meridian cover photo) and the many visitors to the April Sustainability event.

We wanted to update you on the work you may not have seen and to note that these are funded mainly by grants to the Parish Council (PC) or Sustainability Hub, or from developer S106 funding, so minimal impact on residents' Precept funding.

### Sustainability Hub

- Supported by PC and SCDC grants three events at the Memorial Hall have been held with over 100 people at the April event. All included a Repair Café.
- Updates in the Meridian Magazine to help you to fight climate change and make improvements to the way you live and look after our planet.
- Raised planting beds at the Primary School funded by the Hub. Reception children learning about growing plants.
- Around a dozen talks given to other groups, including SCDC grants committee; Cambridge Carbon Footprint workshops; local council Clerks meeting.

### Wildflowers & Bulbs

- Whitton Close, managed by residents and Sustainability Hub. Big success which will be expanded in 2024. SCDC support as it is their land.
- Swan Pond. Huge success and very visible with the wildflowers.
- Wildlife Patch, Moat Way. Set up by the Sustainability Hub. Residents donated and planted lots of plants and helped look after it. Includes a hedgehog box.
- Planting will expand to other village areas. Care will be taken to ensure that areas remain well tended. Spring bulbs also being considered.

### Carters Way/Priory Ave Community Garden

- Raised beds now built and filling up with donated plants.
- Next phase will be managing weed growth and improving the north end of the area. Also painting children's games on the tarmac and enhancing brick walls with painted murals.

### Tree Planting

- SCDC ZCC project for free trees in Parishes. PC will submit a bid for trees for various areas this autumn.

### SCDC Projects

- 22 locations within Housing sites to be enhanced for nature. One is in Swavesey and we will work with SCDC on proposals.
- Local Case Studies – working with SCDC on a case study of Swavesey projects and how the Sustainability Hub promotes work being carried out here.

### Hedgehog Highway

- PC purchased hedgehog highway surrounds, to be distributed via the November Sustainability Hub event.

### Parish Open Spaces

- Existing areas constantly being improved by the PC, Sustainability Hub and residents.
- Community Orchard – new access from Station Rd and a wildlife pond created with grant funding as habitat for great crested newts.
- Constable's Rood Wildlife Garden – flowering cherry tree planted this year in memory of Queen Elisabeth II.

## Sustainability Advice

Keeping warm during winter - hedgehogs, birds and us!

We are all making changes to how we keep ourselves warm during the winter months. One really helpful approach to locate where your home is losing heat is by using a thermal imaging camera: everywhere precious warm air is escaping your building will show up vividly. Search for Cambridge Carbon Footprint thermal imaging camera to borrow one free of charge. You will also need to register for a 1.5hr training session so you are able to use it.

For those of us who made or received bug hotels and bird feeders from the Swavesey Christmas sustainability event, now is a good time to put them to use in your gardens - birds will be looking for scarce food sources and love the high-calorie fat and seed mix, and insects needing a safe place to hibernate. And for anyone who took home a hedgehog highway gateway, please do send us pictures of it installed and any visiting hedgehogs so we can update our nature map of the village ([rvollerthun@gmail.co.uk](mailto:rvollerthun@gmail.co.uk)) - perhaps you've even got a hibernating hedgehog if you've any hospitable areas!

## Memories - Warren Wright

Once I had got my drum-kit, courtesy of the late Mod Godfrey, I saved almost all the payments I had received for my part-time Saturday jobs at both what was then Freestones bakery and later Alsop's grocery shop on the corner of Wallmans lane - now the B & B. In addition I put most of my weekly pocket money into the pot and eventually I had enough to go and buy a classic Grundig tape recorder, which I put to good use by recording much of the 50's & 60's music which was mainly played on Radio Luxembourg and Radio Caroline - one of the several pirate stations broadcasting prior to the BBC originating radio 1 & radio 2 stations. I seem to remember that the price of a single 45 vinyl disc being 6 shillings & 8 pence at the time, about 32p these days! All this equipment enabled me to play along to the tracks whilst on the drums in the first floor attic of the house whilst I was looking for another band who were looking for a drummer.

Back at school in the first year of my 6th form education, I soon realised that the expectation would be that I would go on to finish my A levels and then seek a place in one of our local colleges before getting anywhere near a job, by which time who knows?. One of my teachers obviously realised that my mind was elsewhere and took me aside to ask me what my true ambition was, needless to say I replied that it was to be in the music business though of course I wasn't in a position then of earning a living. Somehow he recommended me to have an interview which was successful and I became a trainee underwriter at the Prudential but earning a living AND of course I was suddenly able to arrange insurance for the group's van & equipment a big issue at the time!

Actually I quite enjoyed my time at the Pru & went on a course for a week to their HQ in Holborn, London, during which we were asked to remove our shoes before being taken into the "computer room" in the mid 60's!! The computer was about the size of a 20 foot container with hundreds of small lights flashing & was basically operated on a card system, just a bit bigger than today's lap-top or smart phone!

The music scene in Cambridge was pretty vibrant at that time in the early 60's, and it wasn't long before I was introduced to another collection of guys of my age group who all had similar ambitions. All the lads lived in Cambridge but I had my train season ticket until I left school after which it wasn't long before I was driving - an old "sit up & beg" Ford Popular. George, the guitarist in the new gang, lived with his mother at the bottom of Round Church St. in the centre of town & his mother had a connection with the first floor hall opposite the Round Church. This was very handy as we could get it for practice when it wasn't booked and also had small storage

space available if necessary. Just at the back of the Church & opposite the Hall were the Union Cellars which had many a live group in for the students - remember seeing the original "Amen Corner" play there before they made the big-time. As well as playing guitar George had the idea of creating a basic stage lighting system we could use when performing, which would be in addition to the lights that most of the local venues provided. So it wasn't long before we had an old pair of PA speaker columns with the internal speakers replaced by 4 lights in each column and in addition another 6 floor wedges, all the lights having some heavy duty theatrical plastic coloured sheets inside. The main control unit was in fact a variable speed record turntable with wire contacts on the metal turntable edge in a safe secure cabinet. Smoke machines were very rare in those days but George had the idea of utilising one of the old ceramic backed portable electric heaters which could be laid on its back with a fan placed behind it, and we were able to go down to a supply shop almost next door to the old Civic theatre in the city centre and purchase some white powder to lay on the fire bars and whoopee we had an-all-be it very primitive but effective smoke machine for the grand finale at the end of our performance. The band by this time was going under the name of " Like Mad " which I guess reflected the members, music & lighting!

## It Will Probably Be Cloudy...

### A guide to the night sky over Swavesey during December and January.

On 4<sup>th</sup> December, the planet Mercury reaches greatest eastern elongation from the Sun. This is a good time to view Mercury as the planet appears at its farthest distance from the Sun in the evening sky. Look for the planet low in the western sky just after sunset.

The Geminids, with a possible hourly rate of 150 meteors per hour, are one of the best meteor shower displays you can see all year. Reaching maximum on 14-15 December, the Moon will be a waxing crescent on the peak, making viewing conditions favourable. As with most showers your best chance to see meteors is in the early hours of the morning around the peak, though a good number should be seen any time from a few hours after sunset. Fill your view with the sky and wait for the lights to appear. And, given this is a midwinter wonder, don't forget to wrap up warm!

The Ursids meteor shower is active annually between 17<sup>th</sup> December and 25<sup>th</sup> December and peaks on the night of 21<sup>st</sup> December with around 10 meteors per hour.

The winter solstice, the shortest day of the year in the northern hemisphere, occurs on 22<sup>nd</sup> December.

This full moon on 27<sup>th</sup> December was known by early Native American tribes as the Cold Moon because this is the time of year when the cold winter air settles in and the nights become long and dark. This moon has also been known as the Long Nights Moon and the Moon Before Yule.

The first major meteor shower of 2024, the Quadrantids are usually active between the end of December and the second week of January, and peak around 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> January. Unlike other meteor showers that tend to stay at their peak for about two days, the peak period of the Quadrantids only lasts a few hours with around 40 meteors per hour. The waning gibbous moon will block out some of the fainter meteors, but if you are patient this could still be a good show.

On 12<sup>th</sup> January, the planet Mercury reaches greatest western elongation from the Sun. It will be at its highest point above the horizon in the morning sky. Look for the planet low in the eastern sky just before sunrise.

The first Full Moon of the year on 25<sup>th</sup> January is known as the Wolf Moon in many northern cultures, named after the howling of hungry wolves lamenting the scarcity of food in midwinter. Other names for this month's full moon include old moon and ice moon.

Things to look out for in 2024 are possible naked-eye visible comets in April and October and notable spaceflight events during the year 2024 including:

NASA plans to launch the Artemis 2 mission on the Space Launch System, sending astronauts around the Moon on a ten-day lunar flyby.

NASA also plans to launch the Europa Clipper in October, which will study the Jovian moon Europa while in orbit around Jupiter.

China plans to send Chang'e 6 in May, which will conduct the first lunar sample return from the far side of the Moon.

Japan plans to launch the Martian Moons Exploration (MMX) spacecraft to collect and bring back samples from one of the moons of Mars, Phobos.

The maiden flight of Blue Origin's New Glenn heavy-lift orbital launch vehicle is planned for August 2024.

## People I Have Met

'In its hey-day the East of England Showground with its access to the A1 was a premier agricultural show : the ground now to be sold. During those busy years and when I was a police dog handler we did rather elaborate and entertaining dog displays in the main arena. A local sheep dog handler also used two of our dogs which we had sat separately by themselves and which he drove sheep round with his dog as part of his driving display. It looked impressive.

Some may recall Barbara Windsor, the 4' 10" bubbly blond who appeared in the Carry on Films and much later on TV in EastEnders. One year Miss Windsor was hired to open the Peterborough Show and mingle a little. Me and a colleague were invited by the show secretary to his office for tea – Miss Winsor was also there. Perhaps, because of some of her associations at that time she chose not look at us in our uniforms, let alone speak. We found it all rather amusing.

At the completely other end of the scale I did sit on a committee with Baroness Warnock. Mary Warnock had been Mistress of Girton College and had realised that some children needed special attention and teaching. From her work came the understanding of Special Educational Needs (SEN) and Specific Learning Difficulties ( SpLD)

I had developed a keen interest in SpLD / Dyslexia and sat with Mary Warnock and others on a British Dyslexia Association (BDA) Committee. I embarked on a 13 year campaign, locally and nationally, to get all dyslexic children identified during their early days at school. This is essential. As a result of my work I did persuade the Education Secretary of the day to introduce new legislation. Whilst this raised some awareness, it was not specific enough to be really effective. I quickly discovered the weakness of politicians, both at county and national level.

All of that was not helped when the Church of England Education Board failed to acknowledge and act upon their responsibilities towards that large group of children. They also chose to ignore the teachings of the Scriptures when I quoted it to them. *But Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to ME and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of heaven'.*

Finally, ponder on this if you will. Might the members of a registered charity relying on public funding and providing several well paid jobs, then work to solve the issues and make themselves redundant ? Not in my experience.

## An update from Fen Drayton Lakes

Whilst out working around the reserve, it's quite common for curious visitors to approach us with questions about how we manage this expansive site and how many staff members are responsible for its upkeep. Their reactions are typically a mix of surprise and appreciation when we say that only two of us are entrusted with the on-site care and maintenance of this sprawling, almost 400-hectare reserve, complete with an extensive network of around 16 kilometres of pathways. It's at this point that we can take the opportunity to extol our unsung heroes without whom we would not be able to cope – our extraordinary team of volunteers, upon whose dedication we heavily rely.

These outstanding individuals play a pivotal role in ensuring the smooth functioning of our reserve. Whether they're walking the trails to pick up litter, inspecting infrastructure for signs of wear and tear, running events to engage the community, extending warm welcomes to visitors in the car park, conducting breeding bird and biodiversity surveys, or undertaking crucial habitat and infrastructure management work, it's safe to say there is virtually no aspect of our operations in which volunteers aren't deeply embedded and we simply could not manage without them. To date this year, from January through to early September, we have logged almost 2000 volunteer hours across the various roles.

Our volunteer force is as diverse as the reserve habitats they help protect. Spanning a wide range of ages, from enthusiastic teenagers to experienced

## Swavesey 100 Years ago (Dec 1923 & Jan 1924) From the Cambridge Chronicle

### POSTAL ALTERATION. 7th Dec. 1923

Commencing on Sunday next, the 9<sup>th</sup> inst., Swavesey Post Office will be open on Sundays, from 9 a.m. to 10.30 a.m., instead of from 8.30 to 10 a.m., as hitherto.

### RESULT OF DRAW. 28th Dec. 1923

The second "draw" in aid of the War Memorial Hall Fund took place on Saturday. The prize-winners were: Mr. Frank Hayward, Elsenham, 977 (suit of clothes), Mr. Philip Franklin, Cottenham, 876 (tea service), Mrs. L. Saintey, Longstanton, 1,218 (dinner service), Mrs. Chaddock, Swavesey, 16 (lamp). Miss G. Allgood, Hardwicke, 813 (box of cigars), Mrs. T. Metcalfe, Swavesey, 922 (cigarettes).

### CAROLS. 28th Dec. 1923

Between 30 and 40 members of the Swavesey Choral Society sang carols in the village streets on Saturday night. Starting from Boxworth End at 8 o'clock, they did not reach the neighbourhood of the railway station until midnight, being sustained on their way by grateful cups of hot coffee, thoughtfully provided by Mr. and Mrs. Jabez Day, when they visited Wallman's-lane. Their excellent singing was greatly appreciated, and the collection on behalf of Addenbrooke's Hospital, begun on Saturday night and finished on Monday, met with a generous response, the contributions amounting to £7 15s.

### ADVERT. 4th Jan. 1924

LOST, on Saturday, 22<sup>nd</sup> December, between Coton, Madingley, Dry Drayton and Swavesey, a Spare Wheel from Ford Motor Van; finder rewarded. – Apply, Spolton, Butcher, Swavesey.

### CHRISTMAS DINNERS. 4th Jan. 1924

The procession of dinners to and from the bakehouses, always a feature in the streets of the village on Sundays and festivals, was especially noticeable on Christmas Day, for on that festive occasion not only was the procession unusually large, but a motor car was employed for the conveyance of the dinner of one family.

### NATIONAL SCHOOL. 11th Jan. 1924

The National School, which has been closed since November 20<sup>th</sup>, in consequence of illness amongst the children, was re-opened on Tuesday. During the interval the building has been disinfected, repainted and the walls distempered.

### FOUND. 18th Jan. 1924

The spare wheel of a motor van, which was lost by Mr. Walter Spolton, Swavesey, between Dry Drayton and Swavesey on December 22<sup>nd</sup>, has been found, through the agency of an advertisement in the "Independent Press." It was picked up on the Huntingdon-road, near the New Inn (Traveller's Rest), and was taken on to St. Ives, whence it was recovered.

### ANCIENT SKATES. 18th Jan. 1924

During the frost in November, Master Alfred Hawkes, aged 15, grandson of Mr. W. H. Key, Swavesey spent some happy hours with companions on a small stretch of ice on a partly-flooded field, between the railway and the river, using a pair of skates on which his great grandfather, who lived at Earith, Hunts., had travelled very many

miles, visiting Welney, Huntingdon and other places, and on which upwards of 80 years, ago he had played "bandy" (hockey) on Mere Fen, Swavesey. The old gentleman used to say that Swavesey men were very rough in the play. The skates are still in excellent condition, though the varnish, or polish, has long since disappeared from the wooden portion. Last week's thaw was a great disappointment to local, and doubtless to many other skaters, who in past years have been in habit of visiting Mere Fen.

### RAILWAY TROUBLE. 25th Jan. 1924

The interruption in the railway service caused inconvenience in the Swavesey district, as elsewhere. On Monday many regular attendants at St. Ives Market accustomed to go by train had to travel to and fro by road, and those who depended on the railway spent weary hours at St. Ives Station waiting for a return train. Milk has been despatched by rail as usual every morning, but on Monday evening some 25 to 30 cans of milk had to remain at the station all night, as no train was available for their conveyance. On other evenings the milk was got away much about the usual time. Daily newspapers have reached Swavesey by road. On Monday not many were missing, and on Tuesday practically the whole of the usual supply came to hand. The reduced size of some of the journals, however, led to amusing inquiries, such as "Where's the rest of my paper? You've only given me half."

### FLOODS. 25th Jan. 1924

Much land around Swavesey is flooded, and in places water is running over the banks.

### HISTON AND DISTRICT LEAGUE. 25th Jan. 1924

#### SWAVESY RESERVES v. RAMPTON

Swavesey 2, Rampton 1.

Played at Swavesey on Saturday. Part of the field was under water, and the rest was saturated, making anything like football almost impossible. The game was played as well as possible, under the conditions, with the above result.

# PARISH & COUNTY NEWS

**From Your DC - Sue Ellington**

Dear All

The Autumn always brings a great deal of activity at South Cambs District Council. Everybody is back from holidays and they need to set the agenda for the coming winter. You may have noticed that the yellow lines in our villages have been painted and new signs are going up outside the school in readiness for the introduction of Civil parking enforcement. This will be managed by the County Council, who will employ traffic wardens, taking it away from the police and making it a civil offence. I have received several complaints recently regarding anti social parking which will also come within the authority of the traffic wardens.

You will have seen on social media, press and local television that there continues to be controversy about the council's project to introduce a 4 day week where employees are expected to do the same work in 4 days as they are employed to do in 5 days for the same pay. At the council meeting on October 5th many questions were asked to ensure clarity but the leader of the council used a procedural clause in the constitution to prevent District Councillors from being allowed to vote to stop the experiment. We were assured that a independent report would be produced and the whole matter will be debated in the new year. But a recent independent report was changed before it was circulated to members so there was some concern that this might recur.

I know Swavesey residents and groups have done a lot to improve nature so I thought the following might be of interest :

The Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Fund for Nature is now open for applications. This small capital grants scheme offers awards of up to £5,000 for communities who wish to do more for nature where they live. Full details can be found at [The deadline for this first round of projects is 1st November](http://www.naturalcambridgeshire.org.uk), for projects due to start in Spring 2024. There will be a further call for projects next year. Applicants will need to show how their project will directly contribute to 'Doubling Nature' and make reference to objectives contained within Natural Cambridgeshire's '[Local Nature Recovery Toolkit](http://www.naturalcambridgeshire.org.uk)'.

# SWAVESEY PARISH

## Parish Council News September/October 2023

### County Council Business - Highways

A site meeting is to be held with National Highways to raise concerns over the roundabouts at the Swavesey A14 junction, relating to speed and HGVs.

The PC and County Cllr continue to ask for a direction sign at the A1307 roundabout, to sign for Northstowe along the A1307, to try to reduce the number of vehicles using Boxworth End-Ramper Rd as a route to Northstowe.

PC reps met with a CCC Traffic Officer to discuss traffic calming measures which are to be funded from the Northstowe S106 monies specifically for this location. The options are under discussion and full consultation with parishioners will be arranged prior to any decision being made.

We have been notified of temporary closure of a section of Market St. & the top end of Cow Fen Drove for surface water gully cleaning. No dates advised but we have also been notified that all the Highway gullies in the village are to be jet cleaned on November 1st.

The yellow parking restriction lines should all be repainted by the end of November.

The 20mph speed limit application wasn't successful in the initial grant funding round but is being entered in the next round for the following financial year.

The introduction of new civil parking enforcement is expected to be introduced in November and we are awaiting details.

We were one of numerous Parishes who wrote in complaining about the lack of weed clearing this year. Following a recent CCC Full Council meeting, the decision and future arrangements are now being reviewed.

### District Council Business - Planning

At the recent Parish liaison meeting issues in Burgess Close relating to lack of road and footpath finishing and the uncompleted junction with Boxworth End, were highlighted. CCC are following this up and we continue to monitor the situation. We have been informed that sections of the foul and surface water sewers under Burgess Close need to be replaced and work will take place shortly, once this has been completed then the highway finishing works will be carried out.

### Greater Cambridge Partnership

The proposal for the St Ives to Cambridge Greenway Over spur route has been deferred, we believe due to rising costs relating to the bridges which would have to be replaced over the Swavesey Main Drain.

# COUNCIL NEWS

The GCP have withdrawn the proposal for the City sustainable travel zone at a cost so far of £4.6 million !!

### Village Projects & maintenance

The war memorial in St Andrew's churchyard has been cleaned in advance of the Remembrance Day service & wreath laying on Sunday November 12th.

The grey poplar trees by the pond in Moat Way were felled for safety reasons. The area will now be replanted over the next year or so with trees more suitable for the location along with hedging and other plants and flowers.

By the time you read this minor repairs will have been carried out to the play equipment in the Moat Way central open space play area and a decision made not to replace the small boundary fencing which had to be removed as it was rotting and unsafe.

### Ongoing Items & Matters to report

The PC is introducing a weekly bulletin for social media updates, which will go out on Facebook with links to more detailed information on the PC's website. The bi-monthly Meridian PC News will still be available in each issue.

The Council was visited by the South Cambs Integrated Neighbourhood Programme Manager, part of the Integrated Care System/NHS, who explained how the organisation's aim is to link the numerous health & welfare groups to enable a closer working partnership to support people in rural areas. Parish Councils involvement is a major aim in the plans to improve health and wellbeing and access to support services for everyone.

### Finance

The PC agreed to provide a grant to help set up the village's new 2nd Brownie Unit.

### Car Parking

Inconsiderate and more to the point illegal parking is becoming a major issue in the village. Recently there has been a drastic increase in vehicles parking on yellow lines and blocking peoples' driveways, often to the point where it would have been impossible for an emergency vehicle such as a fire engine to get through. The morning & mid-afternoon school run times have for a long time been a problem but parking issues are now beginning to occur much more frequently with far more vehicles trying to park close to the primary school. This increases the dangers for those trying to cross the road and negotiate junctions.

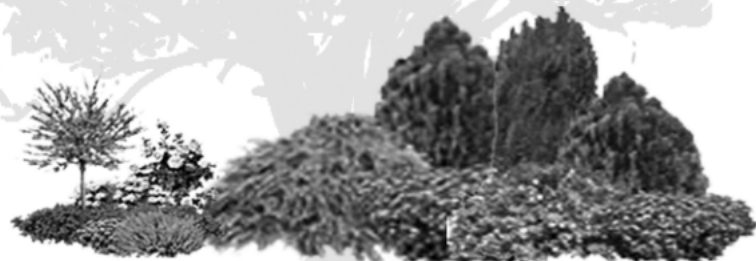

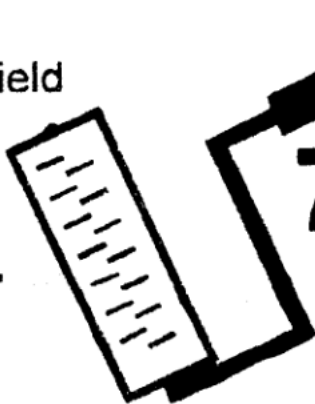
