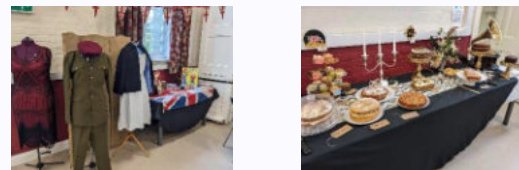

Swavesey Spartans FC

Formed in 1989 the club relies totally on volunteers to provide opportunities for local children from any background to play football in a safe environment.

Spartans' players have had a 3-month break from league and cup games the professional game hardly stops. The final of Euro 2024 hosted by Germany was on 14 July and the new season of Premier League football, the top tier in England, starts on 17 August. Locally Cambridge United remain in the third tier (League 1) of the English Football League (EFL) for 2024/25 and start games on 10 August. In the "hot seat" is Garry Monk the former Swansea, Leeds, Middlesbrough, Birmingham and Sheffield Wednesday Head Coach. He was appointed Head Coach at Cambridge United in March.

Swavesey Spartans reflected on and celebrated the 2023/24 season at the annual Spartans Day event which returned to its traditional home, Swavesey Green, and was held on the traditional Sunday, Fathers Day. We are usually lucky with the weather, but this year proved no exception despite forecasts to the contrary. The most significant change will be the under 9 and below age groups where deliberate heading of the ball will be an offence punished with an indirect free kick. These games will have no throw-ins, instead it will be pass-ins or dribble-ins. This change is protecting players from head injuries; certainly, a step forward from thinking in 1989 when starting grassroots youth football clubs was seen as a huge leap forward.

An update from Fen Drayton Lakes

Our year on the reserve is split into two halves: the autumn-winter habitat management season and the spring-summer breeding season.

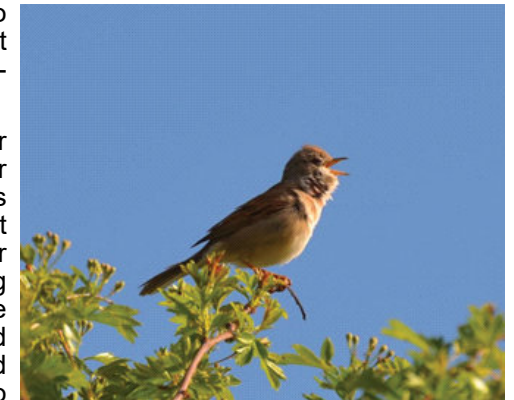
During the colder months of the year there is plenty for us to do. With our volunteer groups, we are kept busy as we go around the reserve carrying out work to maintain or enhance areas for our key breeding species. Nesting islands and rafts on the lakes are cleared of vegetation, willow is removed from reedbeds, scrub is coppiced, and many other tasks are carried out to provide the ideal habitats for our target breeding species.

The spring and summer are when we get to see the results of all this hard work as millions of birds pour into the UK to take advantage of the warmer weather for breeding. There is always some apprehension early in the season as we wait to see which species arrive on site to set up territories and nest. Many of our breeding birds are long distance migrants, spending the winter throughout Sub-Saharan and Southern Africa.

Some, like the Common Whitethroat may have been in Nigeria for the winter. Averaging just 14g, this small bird will fly thousands of miles over its lifetime, often coming back to the same patch of scrub year on year to nest.

As the summer progresses, why not come down to the reserve to look for these, and many other, charismatic birds around the trails.

MISCELLANY

It Will Probably Be Cloudy...

A guide to the night sky over Swavesey during August and September.

The Perseids is one of the best meteor showers to observe. It is produced by comet Swift-Tuttle, which was discovered in 1862. The Perseids are famous for producing a large number of bright meteors, at the peak you could see up to one hundred meteors per hour, and you might even catch some fireballs too. The shower runs annually from 17th July to 24th August. It peaks this year on the night of 11th August and the morning of 12th August.

14th August sees a conjunction of Mars and Jupiter. The planets will pass within 0.31 degrees of each other in the pre-dawn sky.

The full moon on 19th August was known by early Native American tribes as the Sturgeon Moon because the large sturgeon fish of the Great Lakes and other major lakes were more easily caught at this time of year. This moon has also been known as the Green Corn Moon and the Grain Moon. Since this is the third of four full moons in this season, it is known as a blue moon. This rare calendar event only happens once every few years, giving rise to the term, "once in a blue moon." There are normally only three full moons in each season of the year. But since full moons occur every 29.53 days, occasionally a season will contain four full moons. The extra full moon of the season is known as a blue moon. Blue moons occur on average once every 2.7 years.

21st August will see a Lunar Occultation of Saturn. In the UK, the Moon will pass in front of Saturn - an event known as a lunar occultation. This will be in the pre-dawn sky between 04:25–05:23 BST.

On 28th August Comet Tsuchinshan-ATLAS which was discovered at the beginning of 2023, is 30 days from perihelion, its closest point to the Sun. Some calculations suggest that Tsuchinshan-ATLAS might become as brilliant as Venus around 8th October. Hopefully, we will know more for the next issue.

On 5th September, the planet Mercury reaches greatest western elongation from the Sun. This is the best time to view Mercury since it will be at its highest point above the horizon in the morning sky. Look for the planet low in the eastern sky just before sunrise.

On 8th September Saturn will be at opposition. The ringed planet will be at its closest approach to Earth and its face will be fully illuminated by the Sun. It will be brighter than any other time of the year and will be visible all night long.

A medium-sized or larger telescope will allow you to see Saturn's rings and a few of its brightest moons.

The full moon on 18th September was known by early Native American tribes as the Corn Moon because the corn is harvested around this time of year. This moon is also known as the Harvest Moon. The Harvest Moon is the full moon that occurs closest to the September equinox each year. This is also the first of three supermoons for 2024. The Moon will be near its closest approach to the Earth and may look slightly larger and brighter than usual.

Also on 18th September, a partial lunar eclipse will occur when the Moon passes through the Earth's partial shadow, or penumbra, and only a portion of it passes through the darkest shadow, or umbra. During this type of eclipse, a part of the Moon will darken as it moves through the Earth's shadow.

Neptune moves into opposition on 20th September. Due to its extreme distance from Earth, it will only appear as a tiny blue dot in all but the most powerful telescopes.

The Autumnal equinox occurs on 22nd September marking the end of summer and the start of Autumn in the Northern Hemisphere.

Will Wright Memories

Towards the back end of 1966 we were contacted by a local agency who asked if we would like to go to Germany for a few gigs in the forthcoming New Year. Needless to say we said "yes of course," a whole new world was about to open up! So in the last week of January we loaded the van and caught the ferry from Harwich to the harbour town of Bremen which is little more than a stones throw from Hamburg.

Our first and largest venue was a club in Kiel, which is located on the Baltic - not very warm in February, the club was called the "Electric Action" and was more than a club as it was a converted extremely large cinema which could accommodate about a 1000 punters or more. So Kiel was our first port of call and we were scheduled there for 2 weeks performances prior to a visit to Hamburg. It turned out that we had not been given all the info prior to arrival, which we were later to find out was "par for the course". We were expected to play 7 x 45 minute slots each day - 45 minutes on 15 off, except for Friday, Saturday & Sunday when an additional 3 slots were included at lunch time prior to a 3 hour break..

What was slightly intimidating was when one of the club's Bouncers would stand by the side of the stage and tap his watch when it was time for another set. We later found out that the in house bars could charge more for the price of drinks whilst the bands were actually playing. The club had a considerable number of these "gentlemen", several of whom were obviously carrying guns in their outfits!

Accommodation was supplied as promised though it was a very basic room for up to 8 people, and apart from a shower & in-house conveniences it's main benefit was the location being in the club's basement and adjoining the main heating system - essential when residing along the Baltic in winter.

We managed to survive the first couple of weeks and then we were shipped off to Hamburg for the first 2 days of the following week where we performed at the Top Ten Club, just down the road from the well known Star Club, We felt more at home in the Top Ten as it related so much more to the venues we had become used to in the UK prior to returning to Kiel for a further 10 days or so at the "Electric Action". We were then asked if we could do a couple of days in the Star Club back in Hamburg - well there was no way we were going to turn down this offer! not that it made us tax exiles! The accommodation for both short stays in Hamburg was interesting as it was actually on the "Reeperbahn", infamous & interesting but that's all I am saying Selwyn.

What was really interesting here was that we had been meeting a few fellow English musos & the question of promised payments not being made was

constantly arising, especially in connection with some of the promoters we were dealing with, who weren't able to fulfil their obligation but always had another promoter friend who ran a nearby venue who would be able to, funny that wasn't it?

On getting back to the Electric Action in Kiel we asked to see the "main man" as we were not receiving our promised payment, Strangely enough not only was he not available but he wasn't in the town either!!

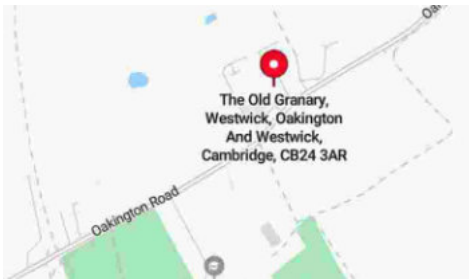

Swavesey 100 years ago (August & September 1924) From the Cambridge Chronicle

ADVERT. 1st Aug. 1924

THATCHING SPITS for Sale, any quantity, large or small orders executed. – Prior's Stores.

DANGERS OF HIGH-STREET. 15th Aug. 1924

Two little children met with accidents in the main street of the village during last weekend. On Sunday morning Walter Isgrove, aged 4½ years, son of Mr. W. D. Isgrove, baker and confectioner, High-street, ran out of the door of his fathers' house to cross the road, and was knocked down by Dr. Ellis' motor car which was passing by. On the following evening Mr. J. Kester's youngest child, when playing with other little children in the road near the schoolhouse, collided with a cyclist. The small child was knocked down, and the cyclist, a youth living at Boxworth, had a nasty spill. Fortunately, neither child sustained serious injuries, and the cyclist escaped with damaged clothing and a shaking.

UNPROFITABLE FRUIT GROWING. 22nd Aug. 1924

A Swavesey resident has not found Lammas pears a profitable investment this year. He sent eight half-sieves of pears to market, where they made 8s. From this amount 5s. 4d. was deducted for railway charges, 8d. for market dues, and 8d. for commission, leaving 1s. 4d. for the grower. Owing to illness, the grower had to employ a man to gather the fruit at a cost of 5s., and therefore found himself out of pocket to the tune of 3s. 8d.

BULL PLAYS HAVOC. 29th Aug. 1924

Breaking through a hedge from an adjoining field, a bull on Thursday week played havoc with the movable fence surrounding the cricket pitch on the Recreation Ground. Charging the fence, the animal tossed the rails and posts high in the air, breaking or splitting many of them. Three or four children, who were playing on the ground, were fortunately able to get out of harm's way. But there might have been a very different tale to tell if the school had not been closed for the harvest holidays.

THE SCHOOL. 12th Sept. 1924

The National School will be re-opened on Monday morning after the summer holiday. During the vacation the interior of the building has been thoroughly cleaned, all the rooms have been re-painted and the walls distempered. Various shades of bluey-green paints have been used for the doors, beams, etc., while the walls are white with a dado of bright bluey-green. The ceiling and window frames have been painted white. The work has been done by Mr. Mitham, Swavesey. The clock outside the school is being repaired, the expense being borne by subscribers in the village, and it is hoped will very shortly be in going order once again.

CRICKET FINALE. 12th Sept. 1924

The Swavesey Cricket Club first eleven, who, as already announced, have achieved the proud position of being at the head of the Turner (Hunts.) Cricket League will on Thursday next receive medals and challenge cup at the hands of its donor, Mr. H. S. Turner, of St. Ives. On that day a match, commencing at 11 a.m., will be played on the Recreation Ground between the Champions and the Rest of the League, the latter team, it is understood, being captained by Mr. Turner. Lunch will be provided in the Memorial Hall at 1.30 p.m. and tea at 4.30, and at 7.30 a concert in aid of the Swavesey Cricket Club Funds will be given in the Hall by Mr. Turner, who will be assisted by friends.

.DISAPPOINTED. 19th Sept. 1924

A Swavesey cottager, the winner of the special prize for gaining most successes at the local show in August, had a sad disappointment on Tuesday when he could not find the splendid specimens of kidney potatoes he had selected for exhibition at this week's Fruit and Vegetable Show in the Corn Exchange, Cambridge. On making inquiry, he ascertained that they had been cooked by mistake for his Sunday dinner, and he then remembered that he had remarked on the exceptional excellence of the potatoes he was eating.



Hello Everybody

Well the election will be over by the time you read this (thank goodness we all say). But I have no intention of talking politics. In my view my most important job is to represent my ward and to identify and fight for improvements which will help the residents. Also I do rely on residents to keep me informed about district council issues which I can investigate or sort. There is nothing more frustrating than not being able to talk to an officer to clear up a problem - answer phones, texts and emails can be very irritating when you have limited time available and prolong the time you worry. I find the current trend to reduce live staff on the end of a phone and being instructed to go on line makes me want to say "if I could have got the answer on line I would not have tried to speak with a live person!"

Right - enough ranting- the answer is - I answer my phone whenever possible.

The Fen Reservoir project continues to move through the planning procedure - the consultation will be closing on 9th August but you may be interested to learn that the large bore pipe carrying the water from the reservoir is planned to be laid along the Coville Drain bank and must have implications for our village. We will hear more about this.

The Community Warden service continues to try to establish ways of being sustainable- it seems a 'no brainer' to me that a service which keeps over 1800 people to continue to live independently in their own homes in South Cambs as opposed to costing £7500 per month per person in a nursing home which social services would have to fund if the person can not fund themselves. This has to be madness so I will go on telling them so and hopefully report progress in the Autumn.

SWAVESEY PARISH

Parish Council News May/June 2024

Cllr Doug Hunt was unanimously re-elected as Chairman for the forthcoming year.

Cllr Sandie Smith was re-elected as Vice-Chair for the coming year.

The May meeting is the Annual meeting of the Parish Council in which all various statutory items have to be concluded prior to getting on with the usual regular Parish Business.

County Council Business

The proposed Station Road closure from 28th to 30th of May was postponed by Cambridge Water and will now be in place between 7th to 9th of August between Middle Fen Drove junction (Swan Pond) and the Guided Busway Crossing.

The five traffic calming consultation events resulted in numerous responses for the wishes of residents for measures to deal with the ever increasing traffic problems we are experiencing. The PC is now reviewing the comments and will discuss these further with the County Council Traffic Officers to update the options available - watch this space BUT we will get there!

The PC will be submitting an Expression of Interest in conjunction with the Hall Trustees, to a grant scheme which could provide an electric car charge point in the Memorial Hall car park.

Having reviewed their weed treatment programme following last year's decision not to spray weeds on the highway, the county highways team have returned to chemical spraying and are due to spray the ever growing weeds on our roads by the time you read this, with a follow up treatment sometime in October.

District Council Business

The District Council is continuing its "experimental" 4 day working week system. Central Government has written to SCDC and raised concerns about this and has asked that SCDC demonstrates how it is delivering its Best Value Duty by collecting data and reporting this to the DLHC. It has requested this for a further six months from May 2024 before taking further action.

Planning

Comments on applications received have been made to Gtr Cambridge Planning, these can be viewed in the Meeting Minutes, published on the Council's website www.swavesey.org.uk

The application for change of use of the business premises at 2-4 Station Rd, to residential use and its conversion into 6 one-bed flats, has raised concerns. In particular with regards to lack of parking space for the proposed 6 flats (and 2

from the previously consented application for the other buildings on the site). Concerns were also raised re the safety of the access onto Station Rd, as well as safety & parking during the construction (should it be permitted).

Drainage

The PC has returned comments on the Anglian Water consultation for the new Fens Reservoir project. This will affect Swavesey only during its construction as the pipeline transferring water from the reservoir to a treatment works at Madingley will be laid through the Parish, from under the River Gt Ouse between Over-Swavesey and south alongside Covell's Drain towards the A14. Comments relating to construction vehicle access along the droves and proximity of the pipe trench to Covell's Drain were made.

Following concerns raised by the PC earlier this year to DEFRA about river water overtopping the Swavesey riverbank this winter into the Swavesey Fens, a reply has been received from DEFRA which the PC will continue to follow up. Swavesey PC and IDB continue to be very concerned over the Environment Agency's lack of general maintenance of flood defences and river infrastructure and continue to raise this with the EA and DEFRA. Similar concerns are also being raised by other Parish Councils along this stretch of the river.

Finance

A grant has been provided to Hale Road Allotment association towards the purchase of a storage unit.

A grant has also been provided to the Swavesey Squash Club towards their continued repairs & improvements to the squash courts.

The RoSPA Play Area Inspection Reports highlighted some minor repairs which have been carried out.

Village Projects

The SVC Experience Week this year, July 8th - 11th, will include litter picking and help with the spreading of bark in the play area.

General Correspondence

A Beer Festival will be held on July 19th & 20th on the Recreation Green to raise funds for the Pavilion.

The Combined Authority has published information on new bus routes, which includes for the Swavesey area, merging the 1A & 5A routes into a new St Ives to Bar Hill service.

Swavesey Memorial Hall – 100 years old (Part 1)

Swavesey's Memorial Hall was officially opened on 15 May 1924, almost exactly five years after the decision was made to build it. During that time the village people themselves raised the money to fund the project, but why was it needed and why was it built at that particular time?



Until 1924 the various churches and chapels would have held their meetings and entertainments within their organisations. Other groups could have held their functions in the larger pubs or the National School situated on the corner of School Lane and High Street (demolished in 1959-61). The Parish Council held their meetings there – a venue far from ideal as the report in the villages section of the Cambridge Weekly News Independent Press & Chronicle pointed out on 24 January 1919:

“It does not add to the dignity of the parish legislators to have to sit on top of school children’s desks facing the Chairman and Clerk more comfortably seated on chairs at a small table, while to squat on the seats is, as I know from painful experience, conducive to cramp and ‘pins and needles.’”

It was also pointed out that “under the New Education Act the school will be needed for educational purposes during the evenings and therefore will not be available for meetings etc.” The village needed a Hall, but what was the catalyst that caused it to be built then and where could it be built?

The country had just been through the devastating Great War which had a profound effect on Swavesey and its inhabitants. A Roll of Honour was compiled during the war and updated where necessary. It recorded the service of Swavesey men and those connected to the village including how many times each had been wounded or gassed. This was displayed in the village,

eventually in a purpose made case in front of where the Hall now stands. From the opening of the Hall, it has had pride of place on the wall inside. Included is a separate Roll of Honour for those who gave their lives, many of whom are buried where they died, or whose names are on one of the many monuments to those whose bodies were never found and have no known grave.

The Parish Council debated what form the Hall should take if the village decided to build one. Major Ellis suggested that the old Mission Church which was at Boxworth End, opposite the end of Rose and Crown Road, could be adapted or there was a suggestion that a YMCA hut used during the war could be bought and used. However, it was decided to build new and the newspaper reported:

“At a well-attended meeting of parishioners on 7 May 1919 it was decided unanimously that the war memorial for the parish should take the form of a village hall and institute, brick and slate built, and that the names of all Swavesey men who served in the war should be inscribed inside the building.”

Having decided to build a Hall the question to be answered was where it should be built. The subject was widely discussed in early 1919. Most opinions quoted in the newspaper of the time were for using a piece of land that had been bequeathed to the parish by George Long, a prominent local figure, at his death in 1902. The Parish Council had a shed on the front portion of land containing items for the use of the village, e.g. the glass covers for the village streetlamps. There had been discussions about using the land for labourers’ cottages. Furthermore, Mr W J Hepher was a tenant with a butcher’s shop on the site.

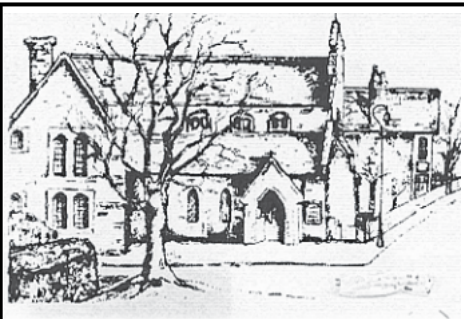
The Swavesey correspondent to the newspaper wrote that: “it would be difficult to find a better position for a hall. The site is in the centre of the village, exactly where a hall should be, and is already the property of the parish”. Subsequently at the meeting on 7 May 1919 it was decided that the memorial hall would be erected on the parish property in High Street.

In December 1922 the newspaper reported that: “The tender for the erection of the War Memorial, submitted by Mr Canham, of Somersham, has been accepted, and work will be commenced immediately.”

By Mid-January 1923: “The work of digging trenches for the foundations of the War Memorial Hall was commenced on Monday.” The newspaper report of 12th October 1923 stated that: “After some discussion the Council resolved unanimously that six months’ notice should be served on Mr W J Hepher, terminating his tenancy of the butcher’s shop and other premises on the property.”

But how could the village fund this large project? To be continued.

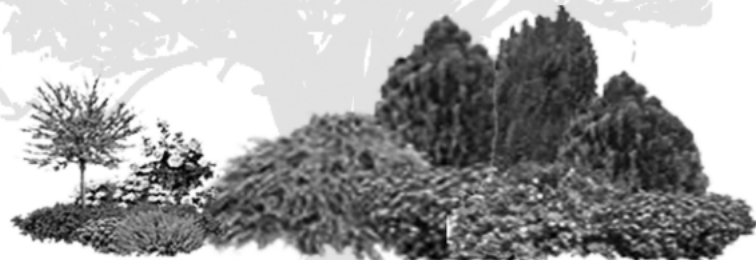

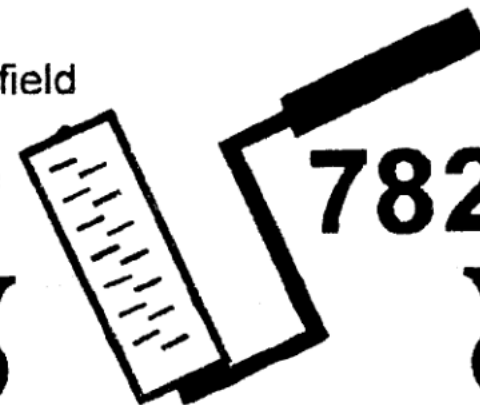
